### STREET AND STORMWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL, 2018

#### 1. STORMWATER PERMIT ACTIVITIES

- a) Twenty-Two (22) stormwater pollution prevention plan inspections were conducted at permitted construction sites.
- b) Twenty-Three (23) Stormwater Individual Lot Permits were issued for new residential construction projects.
- c) Two (2) Stormwater Management Permits were issued for new development projects.
- d) Submitted the required MS4 Annual Report to the Indiana Department of Environmental Management covering Stormwater Program activities from November 16<sup>th</sup>, 2015 through November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The report covers all aspects of the Program and is posted on the Town's website for public inspection.
- e) Issued one (1) Notice of Violation and Fine for construction stormwater pollution prevention violations at a permitted development project.
- f) The Creekfest Planning Committee is working to coordinate this year's event planned for Saturday, August 18<sup>th</sup>. The event will be held from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm and will feature a stream cleanup as well as a variety of other nature-related activities.

#### 2. ZIONSVILLE RD. PROJECT

A bid opening was conducted publicly on for April 19<sup>th</sup> with seven (7) contractors submitting:

Upon review of the bids submitted, Rieth-Riley was confirmed to be the complete, accurate and lowest responsive and responsible bidder and below the engineers' estimate. A Notice of Award has been executed and contract documents are being finalized. The Boone County Redevelopment Commission and the Town of Zionsville are co-owners of this project as joint fund contributors. Construction is anticipated to begin in June, and a more detailed schedule will be made available once received from the contractor.

3. **4<sup>TH</sup> ST. DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT, PHASE II**

This project has reached substantial completion. Pending weather, final completion is expected by the end of May.

4. **3<sup>RD</sup> ST. DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT**

This project has reached substantial completion. Pending weather, final completion is expected by the end of May.

5. **NORTH-SOUTH CONNECTOR**

Design continues on a new roadway segment that will connect the intersection of 850 E./Cooper Rd. with CR 875 E. to the north. The design includes a roundabout at the intersection of 850 E./Cooper Rd. and Oak St. as well as a roundabout at the intersection of CR 875 E. and Whitestown Rd. Construction is anticipated to begin in 2019. This project is fulfilling the future visions of Zionsville's Transportation Plan.

6. **NEW MUNICIPAL FACILITY**

Preliminary site design development is on-going for a new facility to be located at the former Rail-Trail Gardens along CR 875 E. just north of the ZCH Sports Complex. This site, encompassing approximately 24 acres has been purchased by the Town to house both Parks & Rec facilities as well as Street & Stormwater Dept. operations. Preliminary layouts and cost estimates are expected mid-summer.

7. **MAIN ST. BRIDGE PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENTS**

Engineering work continues on a project to improve pedestrian mobility along South Main St., specifically on Bridge 202 crossing Eagle Creek south of the downtown business district. The bridge and approaches will be modified to eliminate the center turn lane, narrow the remaining two lanes and provide a protected, separated 10' multi-use pathway along each side of the road. This alternative to a stand-alone pedestrian bridge will provide pedestrian access on each side of Main St. and is anticipated to be substantially less expensive than a separate pedestrian bridge along only the west side of the road. This project is expected to be completed by the end of 2018.

8. **COMMUNITY CROSSINGS MATCHING GRANT STREET REPAIR PROJECT**

Construction activities have begun on the following projects and are expected to be completed within 120 days:

- Repair and resurface Oak Street from Quail Run Drive to CR 950 East/Sheets Road
- Reconstruction of Parkway Drive in its entirety
- Reconstruction of Brendon Way in its entirety

- Repair and resurface Maxwell Lane
- Installation of new pedestrian crossings, signals, and sidewalks at the intersection of Oak St. and Ford Rd.

9. **CR 700 PATHWAY PROJECT**

Weather permitting, construction of this pathway is expected to resume in May.

10. **2018 ROAD REHAB PROJECT**

Cost estimates and plans for roads to be considered for contracted repair and reconstruction later this summer are expected to be finalized in May. Areas of focus include the Village, Colony Woods and Irongate subdivisions.

11. **HEAVY TRASH COLLECTION**

The annual collection of heavy trash in the urban service district has been set for the week of May 7<sup>th</sup>. This is an opportunity for residents in the urban service district to dispose of non-hazardous household items that are not normally collected with their weekly trash service. Collection will again be on residents' regular trash day during this week, and information and details have been coordinated with the Director of Communications and Community Relations for dissemination. Residents may contact the Street and Stormwater Department directly for this information as well. As with previous years, there will be no charge to residents to dispose of tires or refrigerant-bearing appliances; however, residents wishing to dispose of these items are requested to notify the Street and Stormwater Department as the collection process differs from standard heavy-trash items.
