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STREET AND STORMWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JULY, 2018

1. **STORMWATER PERMIT ACTIVITIES**

- a) Nineteen (19) stormwater pollution prevention plan inspections were conducted at permitted construction sites.
- b) Twelve (12) Stormwater Individual Lot Permits were issued for new residential construction projects.
- c) One (1) Stormwater Management Permit was issued for a new development project.
- d) Issued one (1) Notice of Violation and levied a fine for Stormwater Permit violations at an active construction site.
- e) Conducted a Stormwater Facility Assessment at the Municipal Services Building. These assessments ensure that municipal facilities are properly implementing their Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plans in accordance with the Town's NPDES permit requirements.
- f) Through the Town's membership in the White River Alliance, helped staff a water quality education booth at Camp Belzer featuring a water cycle bracelet activity and Clear Choices Clean Water materials. Hundreds of scouts and their families attend the event.
- g) Participated in the Zion Nature Center's summer camp by presenting a youth-oriented Hoosier Riverwatch training for the Biologist Boot Camp.
- h) Held a staff training for the Street & Stormwater Department on the Town's Stormwater Quality Management Program and NPDES permit requirements, in addition to providing guidance on storm sewer system maintenance and operation.
- i) The Creekfest Planning Committee is working to coordinate this year's event on Saturday, August 18th. The event will be held from 10 am to 1 pm and

features a stream cleanup (registration required) and a variety of other activities.

2. ZIONSVILLE RD. PROJECT

Due to delays in securing additional right of way from the final parcels necessary to construct this project, it has been determined that it is necessary to delay the start of road construction until the spring of 2019. This is also necessary to allow the multiple utilities along the corridor to completely relocate their facilities and get them out of the way of the road expansion. Beginning on or after August 6th, the road will close to through-traffic while clearing takes place with local access being maintained in all directions; this is the removal of all trees, shrubs and plant material along the corridor necessary to accommodate the project. Once the clearing is complete, the utilities will be on site for 60 to 90 days; during this time, the road will be open to through-traffic, but drivers should expect to encounter traffic control personnel. The project is now anticipated to be complete by the end of November, 2019.

3. 4TH ST. DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT, PHASE II

This project has reached final completion with minor punch list items remaining.

4. 3RD ST. DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

This project has reached final completion with minor punch list items remaining.

5. NORTH-SOUTH CONNECTOR

Design continues on a new roadway segment that will connect the intersection of 850 E./Cooper Rd. with CR 875 E. to the north. The design includes a roundabout at the intersection of 850 E./Cooper Rd. and Oak St. as well as a roundabout at the intersection of CR 875 E. and Whitestown Rd. Construction is anticipated to begin in 2019. This project is fulfilling the future visions of Zionsville's Transportation Plan.

6. NEW MUNICIPAL FACILITY

Preliminary site design development is nearing completion for the new facility to be located at the former Rail-Trail Gardens along CR 875 E. just north of the ZCH Sports Complex. This site, encompassing approximately 24 acres has been purchased by the Town to house both Parks & Rec facilities as well as Street & Stormwater Dept. operations. Preliminary layouts and cost estimates are expected mid-summer.

7. MAIN ST. BRIDGE PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENTS

A contract has been executed and a Notice to Proceed issued to Duncan Robertson, Inc. for the modifications to the Main St. bridge over Eagle Creek providing a ten-foot multi-use pathway on each side of the bridge. Work is expected to begin on or after August 13th, with two-way traffic being maintained. The project is expected to be completed by the end of November.

8. COMMUNITY CROSSINGS MATCHING GRANT STREET REPAIR PROJECT

Construction activities are mostly completed on this project, with only the installation of new pedestrian crossings, signals, and sidewalks at the intersection of Oak St. and Ford Rd. and the repair and resurface Oak Street from Quail Run Drive to CR 950 East/Sheets Road remaining.

9. CR 700 PATHWAY PROJECT

Concrete work has resumed on this project and is expected to be completed by August 6th. The placement of the final area of asphalt to tie the pathway into the internal network of Royal Run is expected to be completed immediately thereafter.

10. 2018 ROAD REHAB PROJECT

A contract has been executed with Midwest Paving, LLC and a Notice to Proceed is expected to be issued on August 3rd for the 2018 Road Rehab Program. Streets currently being considered include:

- Pine St. from 8th St. to 9th St.
- 2nd St. from Oak St. to Poplar St.
- 9th St. from Pine St. to Oak St.
- Sycamore St. from 8th St. to 6th St.
- 6th St. from Sycamore to Oak St.
- 3rd St. from Oak St. to Ash St.
- Cedar St. from 3rd St. to 1st St.
- Irongate Circle
- Walden Ct.
- Rockwell Ct.
- Sherwood Ct.
- Holiday Ct.
- Trenton Ct.
- Lynn Ct.
- Redding Ct.
- Garden Pt.
- N. Maxwell Ln.
- Princeton Pl.
- Orchard Pt.

This project also includes two (2) bid alternates: #1) the repair and resurfacing of the public parking lot on Hawthorne St., and #2) the repair and resurfacing of the Municipal Building parking lot. Six (6) contractors submitted on the project, both of which will be done later this year. Work is expected to begin mid-August and be completed by the end of November.

11. 2018 FALL BRUSH AND LIMB AND LEAF COLLECTION

The detailed schedule for these annual fall services for residents in the urban service district is being finalized. It is anticipated that Brush and Limb collection will occur the weeks of October 1st and October 8th, with Leaf Collection beginning the week of October 22nd and running through mid-December.
