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STREET AND STORMWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 2018

1. **STORMWATER PERMIT ACTIVITIES**

- a) Twelve (12) stormwater pollution prevention plan inspections were conducted at permitted construction sites.
- b) Eleven (11) Stormwater Individual Lot Permits were issued for new residential and commercial construction projects.
- c) Issued one (1) Notice of Violation and levied a fine for Stormwater Permit violations at an active construction site.
- d) A second full round of street sweeping was completed on curbed roads in the urban service district collecting and properly disposing of 52.7 tons of debris. The first round completed earlier this year collected 91.3 tons for a total of 144 tons on the year which demonstrates the debris reduction potential of more frequent sweeping. Street sweeping helps keep our roads free from undesirable debris while also preventing this material from being washed to area storm sewers and waterways. Sweeping efforts are ongoing as staff resources and weather conditions allow.
- e) Attended the annual Association of Stormwater and Floodplain Management (INAFRM) conference which provides training and continuing education necessary to satisfy the Town's NPDES Permit requirements and maintain professional certifications.
- f) Assistant Superintendent – Stormwater was invited by IDEM to participate as a representative of central Indiana MS4s on an advisory committee that is helping guide efforts to transition the existing rule-based stormwater NPDES permit requirements to a general permit, in accordance with an EPA directive. Hosted a meeting at Town Hall on September 26th with several area municipalities in attendance to review the proposed rule and solicit comments from our fellow regulated communities to present to IDEM.

2. **ZIONSVILLE RD. PROJECT**

Clearing work has been completed and the road has reopened to through-traffic. Utility work will be on-going over the next few months as various utilities relocate their underground and aerial facilities. One full closure for a few hours is expected to allow Duke Energy to modify their power lines. When the timing of this effort is known, advanced warning will be provided.

3. **3RD ST. DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT**

The project is complete.

4. **NORTH-SOUTH CONNECTOR**

A public meeting to present the current design and potential impacts to the public was held on September 18th, 6:30 pm in the Community Room at the Town Hall. Comments and suggestions are being reviewed and considered as design is finalized, and the displays used at the meeting have been posted to the Town's web site. Individual meetings with property owners will begin in October and negotiations for the purchases of land for the necessary new rights-of-way are expected to take several months.

5. **NEW MUNICIPAL FACILITY**

Preliminary site design development is complete for the new facility to be located at the former Rail-Trail Gardens along CR 875 E. providing a new home for the Street and Stormwater Department as well as the Parks & Recreation Department. Final cost estimates are being refined in anticipation of discussions on methods to finance the project.

6. **MAIN ST. BRIDGE PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENTS**

Work is on-going for this project and is expected to be completed by the end of November.

7. **COMMUNITY CROSSINGS MATCHING GRANT STREET REPAIR PROJECT**

Construction activities are mostly completed on this project, with the repair and resurfacing of Oak Street from Quail Run Drive to CR 950 East/Sheets Road remaining.

8. **2018 ROAD REHAB PROJECT**

Construction activities have begun on the following streets and are expected to be completed by November, initially focused in the Colony Woods subdivision:

- Pine St. from 8th St. to 9th St.
- 2nd St. from Oak St. to Poplar. St.
- 9th St. from Pine St. to Oak St.
- Sycamore St. from 8th St. to 6th St.
- 6th St. from Sycamore to Oak St.
- 3rd St. from Oak St. to Ash St.
- Cedar St. from 3rd St. to 1st St.
- Irongate Circle

This project also includes two (2) bid alternates: #1) the repair and resurfacing of the public parking lot on Hawthorne St., and #2) the repair and resurfacing of the Municipal Building parking lot.

9. CR 300 PLANNING GRANT

Through a joint application with the Boone County Highway Department, the Indianapolis MPO has awarded \$82,500 out of a total of \$150,000 to fund a planning study of CR 300 to determine future demands, needs and capacities. The local contribution of \$67,500 will be split between Boone County and Zionsville. The selection of a professional consultant is expected to be by mid-October, and the subsequent planning process is expected to include public input meetings.

10. 2018 FALL LEAF COLLECTION

Curbside leaf collection for residents in the urban service district will begin the week of October 22nd and run through December 7th, pending winter weather. Additional days may be added depending on the need and favorable weather.

11. 2018 FALL BRUSH AND LIMB COLLECTION

The fall round of brush and limb collection for residents in the urban service district begins Monday, October 1st.

Fall 2018 Brush & Limb Collection

The Town of Zionsville's Street & Stormwater Department will be providing curbside Brush & Limb Collection **beginning Monday, October 1, 2018**. This service provides Zionsville residents in the Urban Service District a means to dispose of certain pruning and yard debris. We cannot guarantee the collection unless your items are out curbside by 7:30 a.m. on your designated pick-up day.

The limit on size is 6 inches in diameter and smaller. Grass clippings, leaves, decorative grass, vines, stumps, root balls, construction lumber, firewood, and wooden fencing material will **NOT** be collected. Bundling is not required. Limbs up to 6 inches in diameter may be left intact but should be no larger than can be managed by one person.
