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### STREET AND STORMWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 2019

#### 1. **STORMWATER PERMIT ACTIVITIES**

- a) Nineteen (19) stormwater pollution prevention plan inspections were conducted at permitted construction sites.
- b) Eighteen (18) Stormwater Individual Lot Permits were issued for new residential construction projects.
- c) Three (3) Stormwater Management Permits were issued for new development projects.
- d) Issued two (2) Notice of Violation for active construction sites. No fines were issued.
- e) The Creekfest Planning Committee is working to coordinate this year's event planned for Saturday, August 10th. The event will be held from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm. The stream clean-up portion to be determined at later date.

#### 2. **IRONGATE DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT**

This project, designed to help mitigate historical drainage issues along W. Oak Street and Irongate Drive, is expected to be put out for public bid in March.

#### 3. **ZIONSVILLE RD. PROJECT**

Utility relocation work has begun. One full closure for a 1 -2 hours will be necessary to allow Duke Energy to modify their power lines between March 18<sup>th</sup> and March 28<sup>th</sup>; advanced notice will be provided when details are determined. It is expected that the road closure for construction will occur on April 1<sup>st</sup>, and the road is anticipated to remain closed to through-traffic until November. Local access for residents and businesses will be provided.

#### 4. **NORTH-SOUTH CONNECTOR**

Design work is nearing completion for this project, and offers to purchase right of way have been completed on 12 out of 21 parcels with four (4) parcels having been secured. A definitive construction schedule is not yet known, and all efforts are being made to begin work in the spring of 2019.

5. **2018 ROAD REHAB PROJECT**

Work is starting up again on projects begun last fall. Preparatory concrete work is on-going in the village area, and paving activities are anticipated to begin in late March or early April in both the village area and Colony Woods subdivision.

6. **2019 ROAD REHAB PROJECT**

Preliminary design work is ongoing for roads currently under consideration for resurfacing and rehabilitation in 2019. The final list of roads will be released upon completion of final estimates.

7. **TRAFFIC DATA COLLECTION**

Traffic counts and data collection is on-going town-wide for major intersections and roadways. This data will be used later in 2019 to update the Traffic Impact Fee ordinance.

8. **SPRING BRUSH AND LIMB COLLECTION**

The spring round of brush and limb collection for Zionsville residents in the urban district has been scheduled for the weeks of April 15<sup>th</sup> and April 22<sup>nd</sup>. In an effort to maximize productivity, there will be a major change to the schedule and process beginning with this spring's collection. In the past, the town was divided into 10 regions, each with a specific scheduled day of collection over a two-week period. Beginning this year, largely due to expanded service areas as a result of the transition of several areas from the rural to the urban service area, the town will be divided into only two (2) larger regions. All residents within each area will be required to place their brush and limbs on the Monday of their week. Town crews will then make as much progress as possible each day, and have all brush and limbs collected by the end of the week. It is the hope that by placing all material curbside on one single day, crews will be able to maximize each day's effort and conclude in a shorter time period as well as easier for residents. The specific schedule and areas, once finalized, will be posted to the Town's web site and coordinated with the Director of Communications and Community Relations for dissemination. Residents may contact the Street and Stormwater Department for their specific week of collection.

9. **ANNUAL HEAVY TRASH COLLECTION**

The annual collection of heavy trash in the urban service district has been set for the week of May 6<sup>th</sup>. This is an opportunity for residents in the urban service district to dispose of non-hazardous household items that are not normally collected with their weekly trash service. Collection will again be on residents' regular trash day during this week, and information and details will be coordinated with the Director of Communications and Community Relations for dissemination. Residents may contact the Street and Stormwater Department directly for information as well. As with previous years, there will be no charge to residents to dispose of tires or refrigerant-bearing appliances; however, residents wishing to dispose of these items are requested to notify the Street and Stormwater Department as the collection process differs from standard heavy-trash items.
