WHAT:

The demolition of the PNC bank building at 390 S. Main Street.

The PNC bank building is being torn down and the lot will be resurfaced. Zionsville Locksmith & Safe is included in this demolition project.

WHY:

The PNC bank building is currently vacant. The demolition project is a symbolic moment for the future of the gateway into Zionsville's historic Brick Street. The demolition is also the first stage of the Gateway Development Project, a discussion of how this area will look in the future.
