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### STREET AND STORMWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 2015

#### 1. **STORMWATER PERMIT ACTIVITIES**

- a. Eleven (11) stormwater pollution prevention plan inspections were conducted at permitted construction sites.
- b. Four (4) Stormwater Individual Lot Permits were issued for new residential construction projects.
- c. Coordinated a facility cleanup at the Municipal Services Building including contracting for the proper disposal of old and unused hazardous wastes. Also implemented new pollution prevention measures including providing spill kits in select vehicles and establishing storage containers and disposal services for used absorbents and fluorescent light bulbs.
- d. Participating in the planning and coordination of the WRA's 2015 Trained Individual Contractor's Workshop to be held on March 5<sup>th</sup>.
- e. Completed a project in ThinkGIS to identify ownership of all mapped storm sewer infrastructure.
- f. Working with several community partners and organizations, including the White River Alliance, Sullivan Munce Cultural Center, Parks Department and Union Elementary to plan 2015 public education and participation activities.

#### 2. **STORMWATER PROJECTS AND DRAINAGE**

#### 3. **ADA/SECTION 504 COMPLIANCE**

A public input meeting was held on January 8, 2015 at 6:30 pm in the Community Room of the Zionsville Town Hall. Although the number of attendees was very light at two (2), the input and work session were very valuable. The consultant is finalizing the plan for presentation to the council at a later date based on comments received at the public meeting.

4. **106<sup>TH</sup> ST. AND MAIN ST./ZIONSVILLE RD. SIGNAL PROJECT**

Power has been established at the signal, and the signals have been successfully tested. The signals will not be made operational until the line striping and stop bar pavement markings can be installed due to liability issues. Although permanent pavement markings cannot be installed until pavement and air temperatures are near 60 degrees, a plan has been put into place for temporary pavement markings. However, even these require temperatures to be in the mid-40 degree range and will have to wait until weather permits their installation. The signal will be made operational as soon as practicable.

5. **FORD RD. ROUNDABOUT**

The residence at the southeast corner of the project has been razed, and utilities are commencing the completion of their relocation work prior to the project. The construction project is planned to be let on April 2<sup>nd</sup> with a 3:00 pm bid-opening at the Town Hall.

6. **106<sup>th</sup> St. Improvement Project/Lids Entrance**

The construction of the entrance into the Lids project, which is part of the incentive package to get the Lid's headquarters to locate in Zionsville, as well as the turn lanes to accommodate the future entrance into Creekside Corporate Park is currently out for bid. The project will be let on March 19<sup>th</sup> with a 3:00 pm bid-opening at Town Hall. Construction activities are expected to start the middle of April.
