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### STREET AND STORMWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 2014

#### 1. **STORMWATER PERMIT ACTIVITIES**

- a. Nine (9) stormwater pollution prevention plan inspections were conducted at permitted construction sites.
- b. Six (6) Stormwater Individual Lot Permits were issued for new residential construction projects.
- c. All ten (10) of the decorated rain barrels, produced by the collaborative efforts of the Zionsville Street and Stormwater Department and local volunteer artists through the Sullivan Munce Cultural Center, were auctioned-off at the Do It Again Recycled Art Market at Town Hall. Prior to the sale, the barrels were put on public display at various businesses throughout Zionsville. The barrels sold for more than \$1,600 total which will benefit the Center. The two (2) remaining rain barrels are being decorated by the Alpha Leos Club and will be auctioned-off to benefit The Hawk Foundation.
- d. Conducted a semi-annual stormwater facility assessment at Fire Station 92. These assessments help the town meet its NPDES permit requirements for Municipal Operations Good Housekeeping and Pollution Prevention.

#### 2. **STORMWATER MANAGEMENT BOARD**

#### 3. **STORMWATER PROJECTS AND DRAINAGE**

- a. Work is complete on a project to evaluate existing storm sewer infrastructure in the Village area and develop preliminary engineering plans for potential future improvements. The focus area for the project is approximately 1330 linear feet of storm sewer located primarily along Fourth Street from north of West Oak Street to south of Sycamore Street. This area collects runoff from the majority of the residential Village area and represents the furthest downstream, most significant capacity restriction.
- b. Work is ongoing on a project to evaluate existing storm sewer infrastructure in the Irongate subdivision and surrounding areas for storm sewer mapping verification purposes and capacity analysis. This area has a history of

drainage problems during large rain events which have resulted in temporary road closures.

4. **ADA/SECTION 504 COMPLIANCE**

As a final element in the development of the town's ADA Transition Plan, a public input meeting is being scheduled in December as an opportunity for the public to provide input on mobility obstacles encountered in the urban district and offer suggestions to improve conditions for those with mobility impediments. The plan that will result from this initiative is required by Federal Highway in order for the town to be eligible for federal funding for projects.

5. **2014 STREET REPAIR PROGRAM**

Project is complete and under budget.

6. **106<sup>TH</sup> ST. AND MAIN ST./ZIONSVILLE RD. SIGNAL PROJECT**

Construction has begun. The decorative signal poles are expected to be delivered the first week of December, and the project is expected to be complete by the end of December, pending weather and specialized material production.

7. **FORD RD. ROUNDABOUT**

The town is in the process of closing on the property at the southeast corner of the intersection, and should take possession the first week of December. Demolition of the residence will occur as soon thereafter as possible to permit utility relocation prior to construction. It is anticipated that the project will be let in early 2015 to allow the utility companies to relocate their facilities in advance of a spring 2015 start of construction.

8. **FORMER PNC BANK PROPERTY**

Upon completion of the design development plans for the double roundabout at the intersection of Main and Sycamore Streets, A&F Engineering has been contracted to identify the necessary right-of-way for the roundabout on only the former PNC parcel so the remaining residual property can be sold if it is the will of the Council. This task has been completed with a diagram developed to show potential purchasers and legal descriptions to record at the time of sale.
