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STREET AND STORMWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 2014

1. **STORMWATER PERMIT ACTIVITIES**

- a. Eighteen (18) stormwater pollution prevention plan inspections were conducted at permitted construction sites.
- b. Five (5) Stormwater Individual Lot Permits were issued for new residential construction projects.
- c. Four (4) Stormwater Management Permits were issued for new construction projects.
- d. Working with the Sullivan Munce Cultural Center and the Zionsville Alpha Leos Club on a rain barrel design and education program. Held a rain barrel workshop at the Sullivan Munce Cultural Center on October 11th with six (6) total participants. The decorated rain barrels are being put on display at businesses throughout Zionsville and will be auctioned off at the Do It Again Recycled Art Market on November 8th at Town Hall.
- e. With the assistance of the Wastewater Department, conducting follow-up outfall screening on storm sewers previously identified as having potential illicit discharges and/or illegal connections. Outfall screening for illicit discharges is required under the Town's NPDES permit.
- f. Conducted semi-annual stormwater facility assessments at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, Golf Course, and Fire Stations 91 & 93. These assessments help the Town meet its NPDES permit requirements for Municipal Operations Good Housekeeping and Pollution Prevention.
- g. The Indiana Department of Environmental Management has announced plans to conduct a compliance audit of the Town's Stormwater Quality Management Program in 2015 and will focus on Municipal Operations Pollution Prevention. Working with Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. to evaluate the Town's existing program to help prepare for the upcoming audit.

2. **STORMWATER MANAGEMENT BOARD**

3. **STORMWATER PROJECTS AND DRAINAGE**

- a. Work is nearing completion on a project to evaluate existing storm sewer infrastructure in the Village area and develop preliminary engineering plans for potential future improvements. The focus area for the project is approximately 1330 linear feet of storm sewer located primarily along Fourth Street from north of West Oak Street to south of Sycamore Street. This area collects runoff from the majority of the residential Village area and represents the furthest downstream, most significant capacity restriction.
- b. Work is ongoing on a project to evaluate existing storm sewer infrastructure in the Irongate subdivision and surrounding areas for storm sewer mapping verification purposes and capacity analysis. This area has a history of drainage problems during large rain events which have resulted in temporary road closures.

4. **BENNETT PARKWAY EXTENSION PROJECT**

This project has reached final completion and closeout documentation is being finalized. The project came in under the allotted budget in the construction fund of the bond issuance specific for this project.

5. **ADA/SECTION 504 COMPLIANCE**

Town staff has met with the consultant, VS Engineering, preparing the Town's ADA Transition Plan to review the draft documents. VS is finalizing the plan components in anticipation of a public meeting within the next two months. The plan that will result from this initiative is required by Federal Highway in order for the Town to be eligible for federal funding for projects.

6. **2014 STREET REPAIR PROGRAM**

Only one street and one alley remain to be completed under this year's program. Eagle View Ct. is receiving new sanitary sewers under a separate project and that work must be completed prior to road restoration.

7. **106TH ST. AND MAIN ST./ZIONSVILLE RD. SIGNAL PROJECT**

The construction contract has been executed, and preliminary activities have begun. The decorative signal poles are expected to be delivered the first week of December, and the project is expected to be complete by the end of December, pending weather and specialized material production.

8. **FORD RD. ROUNDABOUT**

Word has been received that Fannie Mae intends to accept the Town's pre-filing offer to avoid condemnation proceedings against the property at the southeast corner of the intersection. Accordingly, the Town's buyer and legal team are coordinating to conclude this acquisition. It is anticipated that the project will be

let in early 2015 to allow the utility companies to relocate their facilities in advance of a spring 2015 start of construction.

9. FORMER PNC BANK PROPERTY

Upon completion of the design development plans for the double roundabout at the intersection of Main and Sycamore Streets, A&F Engineering has been contracted to identify the necessary right-of-way for the roundabout on only the former PNC parcel so the remaining residual property can be sold if it is the will of the Council. This task is unfunded and is expected to cost approximately \$4000 and should be completed by the end of November.

10. FALL LEAF COLLECTION

The seasonal curbside collection of leaves for residents in the urban service district began the week of October 20th. The final day for residents to have leaves at the curbside for collection is December 1st, unless early snow events require the suspension of the service.

Fall 2014 Brush & Limb Collection

The Town of Zionsville's Street & Stormwater Department will be providing curbside Brush & Limb Collection **beginning Monday, October 6, 2014**. This service provides Zionsville residents in the Urban district a means to dispose of certain Fall pruning and yard debris. We cannot guarantee the collection unless your items are out curbside by 7:30 a.m. on your designated pick-up day.

Limit on size is 6 inches in diameter. Grass clippings, leaves, decorative grass, vines, stumps, root balls, construction lumber, firewood, and wooden fencing material will **NOT** be collected. Bundling is not required. Limbs up to 6 inches in diameter may be left intact but should be no larger than can be managed by one person.
