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STREET AND STORMWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 2013

1. **STORMWATER PERMIT ACTIVITIES**

- Routine inspections of nineteen (19) Rule 5-permitted construction sites were conducted last month.
- Began conducting inspections of publicly and privately-owned stormwater Best Management Practices (BMPs) located in Zionsville. These inspections help ensure that BMPs are being properly maintained and are providing the intended water quality and quantity benefits.
- Conducted a semi-annual stormwater facility assessment at Fire Station 93. The purpose of the assessment is to determine if the individual Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan is being properly implemented.
- The Infrastructure Subcommittee of the Town Council along with town staff and Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. have completed work on the comprehensive revision of the Stormwater Ordinance and Technical Standards Manual which will be presented to the Town Council for consideration at their December meeting.
- At the request of the Town Council, a Center for Watershed Protection Webcast titled “Stormwater Utilities: Reckoning the Cost Side of the Equation” was presented at Town Hall. The publicly-noticed webcast was attended by three (3) Council members and one member of the public.

2. **STORMWATER MANAGEMENT BOARD**

3. **STORMWATER PROJECTS AND DRAINAGE**

Project(s) completed; no activity.

4. **FIRST STREET PROJECT**

The design development plans have been finalized and posted to the project web site at www.reasite.com/firststreet/. The public meeting scheduled to follow the finalization of the design has been placed on hold pending the incorporation of a traffic flow study of the corridor

which may affect certain elements. The public presentation will be scheduled once it has been determined that no further changes to the design will result from the traffic flow study.

5. ROAD IMPACT FEE UPDATE

A final meeting of the study committee was held on November 14th to review the report. The committee was tasked with providing any final input in anticipation of the Plan Commission conducting the required hearing at its December 16th meeting. A recommendation will be provided by the Plan Commission to the Town Council to be considered at an upcoming Town Council meeting.

6. BENNETT PARKWAY EXTENSION PROJECT

All project elements have been completed with the exception of the pathway along the west side of the road. Due to weather and other delays beyond the contractor's control, this item will be completed in the spring.

7. ANNUAL STREET REPAIRS

All project elements have been completed with the exception of a pathway segment along Ford Rd. south of Bloor Ln. This pathway was added to the contract due to favorable pricing, but must be deferred until spring due to inclement weather conditions.

8. FORD ROAD INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

Design work is nearly complete, and right-of-way engineering to determine the necessary additional property for the project is also complete. A presentation on the project is included on the December Council meeting agenda. Pending no significant objections or changes, contact by the Town Engineer with property owners from whom additional land is necessary will begin in December.

9. SEASONAL LEAF COLLECTION

Curbside leaf collection for residents in the urban service district is on-going weekly and will continue through the week of December 2nd, pending the onset of snow or icy weather.
