STREET AND STORMWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 2013

1. **STORMWATER PERMIT ACTIVITIES**

- Routine inspections of twenty three (23) Rule 5-permitted construction sites were conducted last month.
- Conducted a final inspection and processed the Rule 5 Notice of Termination for one (1) construction project.
- Hosted the Monroe County Drainage Engineer and three of his staff members for a tour of stormwater best management practices (BMPs) installed throughout Zionsville. BMPs included rain garden planters in The Village, infiltration trenches and bioretention at Zionsville parks facilities, and porous pavers at the Ford Road Walgreens.
- Submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) to comply with 327 IAC 15-13 (Rule 13) to the Indiana Department of Environmental Management to renew the town's National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit. The town is required to maintain NPDES permit coverage allowing for the discharge of stormwater to waters of the state of Indiana. This will be the town's third consecutive five (5) year permit.
- Working with the Infrastructure Subcommittee of the Town Council and Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. to complete a comprehensive revision of the Stormwater Ordinance and Technical Standards Manual.
- Conducted semi-annual stormwater facility assessments at Fire Stations 91 and 92, the Wastewater Treatment Plant and the Zionsville Golf Course. The purpose of the assessments is to determine if the individual Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plans are being properly implemented at each facility which helps the town meet NPDES permit requirements for stormwater.

2. **STORMWATER MANAGEMENT BOARD**

No Activity.

3. **STORMWATER PROJECTS AND DRAINAGE**

A project to address ponding issues on the pathway along CR 975 E. is complete. Existing storm sewer inlets have been improved, ditch grading work along the pathway has been completed and a new storm sewer has been installed.

4. **FIRST STREET PROJECT**

The design development plans have been finalized and posted to the project web site at www.reasite.com/firststreet/. The public meeting scheduled to follow the finalization of the design has been placed on hold pending the incorporation of a traffic flow study of the corridor which may affect certain elements. The public presentation will be scheduled once it has been determined that no further changes to the design will result from the traffic flow study.

5. **ROAD IMPACT FEE UPDATE**

A final draft of the Road Impact Fee Study was submitted by A&F Engineering on October 8th. A final meeting of the study committee is being scheduled for November.

6. **BENNETT PARKWAY EXTENSION PROJECT**

Weather has hampered the progress of this project, but the paving has been completed with the exception of the surface layer. Use of the road to access the FedEx site has been granted allowing that project to continue. Discussions are on-going as to whether or not the pathway will be able to be installed yet this year due to inclement weather and other factors; however, it appears as though the pathway will have to be delayed until spring. All other elements of the project are expected to be complete this year.

7. **ANNUAL STREET REPAIRS**

Paving and reconstruction work included in the original contract are complete. Work that was added to the project due to favorable pricing includes the surfacing of streets within the Rock Bridge subdivision and the replacement of a pathway segment along Ford Rd. north of Village Walk Dr. These areas are expected to be complete by the end of November.

8. **FORD ROAD INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS**

Design work is on-going, and is nearing completion. Right-of-way engineering to determine the necessary additional property for the project is also nearing completion, and offers to property owners are forthcoming early in 2014. Councilors Hopper and Ulmer, along with Town Manager Mitro attended the annual meeting of the Village Walk HOA along with the Street and Stormwater Superintendent and engineers to present the project and field questions. Other than concerns over inconveniences anticipated due to the elimination of one of the three entrances into Village Walk, no other significant objections were encountered.

9. **SEASONAL LEAF COLLECTION**

Curbside leaf collection for residents in the urban service district is on-going weekly and will continue through the week of December 2nd, pending the onset of snow or icy weather.
