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### STREET AND STORMWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 2013

#### 1. **STORMWATER PERMIT ACTIVITIES**

- Routine inspections of nineteen (19) Rule 5-permitted construction sites were conducted last month.
- Conducted a final inspection and processed the Rule 5 Notice of Termination for one (1) development project.
- Worked with resident Todd Settle and the Parks Department to coordinate a stream cleanup event in Eagle Creek on September 14<sup>th</sup>. Over 40 volunteers participated in the event and helped removed 2,600 pounds of trash from the creek.
- Assisted with the Zion Nature Center's annual Creekstomp event. Approximately 80 children and their parents spent the afternoon in Eagle Creek learning about local wildlife and water quality.
- Working with the Infrastructure Subcommittee of the Town Council and Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. to complete a comprehensive revision of the Stormwater Ordinance and Technical Standards Manual
- Issued public notice for the impending submittal to the Indiana Department of Environmental Management of the town's Notice of Intent (NOI) to comply with 327 IAC 15-13 (Rule 13). The town holds a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit to discharge stormwater to waters of the state of Indiana. This will be the town's third consecutive five (5) year permit.

#### 2. **STORMWATER MANAGEMENT BOARD**

No Activity.

#### 3. **STORMWATER PROJECTS AND DRAINAGE**

- A project to address ponding issues on the pathway along CR 975 E. is ongoing. Existing storm sewer inlets have been improved, ditch grading work along the pathway has been completed and a new storm sewer is scheduled for installation in October.

**4. FIRST STREET PROJECT**

The design development plans have been finalized and posted to the project web site at [www.reasite.com/firststreet/](http://www.reasite.com/firststreet/). The public meeting scheduled to follow the finalization of the design has been placed on hold pending the incorporation of a traffic flow study of the corridor which may affect certain elements. The public presentation will be scheduled once it has been determined that no further changes to the design will result from the traffic flow study.

**5. ROAD IMPACT FEE UPDATE**

A&F Engineering submitted the draft reports on Friday, June 28; staff has reviewed the documents and provided input and comment. The report cannot be finalized until the results of the corridor study being performed by the same firm is complete, at which time the findings and decisions of said corridor review will be incorporated into the recommendations and calculations of the road impact fee report.

**6. BENNETT PARKWAY EXTENSION PROJECT**

Paving and curb installation is on-going and expected to continue through next month. Pending weather delays, the project is expected to reach substantial completion by the end of October.

**7. ANNUAL STREET REPAIRS**

Paving and reconstruction work is on-going on this project, and pending weather delays is expected to be substantially complete by the end of October.

A pathway segment is scheduled for replacement during October along the west side of Ford Rd. from south of Bloor Lane to Village Walk Drive. During this project, the pathway will be completely removed and replaced.

**8. FORD ROAD INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS**

Design work is on-going, and approximately 55% complete.

**9. WELCOME SIGNAGE**

Installation of welcome signs along SR 32 and US 421 has been completed.

**10. DOWNTOWN SIDEWALK REPLACEMENT**

The scheduled replacement of approximately 2 ½ blocks in the downtown business district from Poplar Street to Pine Street is substantially complete. Three additional areas beyond the original scope were added to replace poor curb ramps. The project was completed earlier than anticipated, under budget and below construction estimates.

**11. GENERAL SIDEWALK REPLACEMENT**

Replacement of sections of sidewalks along the east side of Ford Rd. north of Starkey Ave. are on-going and will continue through October. This stretch was identified as a priority area due to poor conditions and the high volume of pedestrians in the vicinity of a retirement center.


**12. SEASONAL LEAF COLLECTION**

Curbside leaf collection for residents in the urban service district will begin October 21<sup>st</sup> and continue through the week of December 2<sup>nd</sup>, pending the onset of snow or icy weather.

**13. FALL BRUSH AND LIMB COLLECTION**

The fall round of brush and limb collection for Zionsville residents in the urban district has been scheduled for the weeks of October 7<sup>th</sup> and October 14<sup>th</sup>. The specific schedule has been posted to the Town's web site and will be advertised in the Times Sentinel. The Town of Zionsville's Street & Stormwater Department will be providing curbside Brush & Limb Collection **beginning Monday, October 7, 2013**. This service provides Zionsville residents in the Urban district a means to dispose of certain Fall pruning and yard debris. We cannot guarantee the collection unless your items are out curbside by 7:30 a.m. on your designated pick-up day.

Limit on size is 6 inches in diameter. Grass clippings, leaves, decorative grass, vines, stumps, root balls, construction lumber, firewood, and wooden fencing material will NOT be collected. Bundling is not required. Limbs up to 6 inches in diameter may be left intact but should be no larger than can be managed by one person.
