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STREET AND STORMWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 2016

1. **STORMWATER PERMIT ACTIVITIES**

- a) Twenty seven (27) stormwater pollution prevention plan inspections were conducted at permitted construction sites.
- b) Nine (9) Stormwater Individual Lot Permits were issued for new residential construction projects.
- c) One (1) Stormwater Management Permit was issued for a new development project.
- d) Participated in the Indiana Association of Stormwater and Floodplain Managers Annual Conference as a planning committee member and presenter. Participated in planning committee meetings and conference calls throughout the year and served in a supporting role during conference. Presented on the implementation of a construction stormwater pollution prevention program.

2. **STORMWATER PROJECTS AND DRAINAGE**

- a) Work continues on the development of a storm sewer pipe condition rating procedure utilizing the towns existing televising library.
- b) Work is ongoing on an in-house survey of storm sewer structures in the Village to develop condition ratings and help prioritize future repairs.
- c) Work is ongoing on an update to the Stormwater Technical Standards Manual. This effort is intended to bring current any outdated standards and to improve the organization of the Manual for the benefit of town staff and the construction community alike.

3. 96TH ST./ZIONSVILLE RD. INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS

Negotiations have successfully concluded with the two remaining property owners from whom additional right of way is needed for this project. Final design and specifications are being finalized in anticipation of a November bid for construction. It is anticipated that utility relocation will occur during the winter, and the reconstruction of the intersection will begin in the spring of 2017.

4. BLOOR LANE PATHWAY

Construction is under way on this project, and substantial completion is expected by mid-November.

5. OAK ST. AND KISSEL/800 E. INTERSECTION

Due largely to favorable pricing on other projects, available funds have been identified to allow this project to move into design. The town engineer has been authorized to begin design work with the goal of completing the installation of the signal before the end of the year.

6. ZIONSVILLE RD. PROJECT

Staff has completed review of the engineering assessment developed by the Town Engineer, and a meeting will be scheduled in the near future with residents along the Zionsville Rd. corridor to discuss options. Once a preferred design concept has been identified, actual design will commence.

7. 116TH ST. PATHWAY PROJECT

The interlocal agreement between Carmel and Zionsville has been signed by the Town and is awaiting final signature by the other entity to enter into a design contract for a pathway project along 116th St. from Michigan Rd. east to Carmel's existing pathway network. Once approved, design will commence on this project, tentatively scheduled to begin construction later in 2017.

8. 2016 PAVING PROGRAM

Work is ongoing along the various roads included in this year's road rehab project:

- Willow Rd. west of US 421
- Starkey Ave.
- Temple Ave.
- CR 975 E.
- Bloor Lane
- Ash St. (Elm St. to Maple St.)
- Village Ct.
- Turkeyfoot Ave.
- Stevens Rd.
- CR 950 E.
- First St. (Oak St. to Ash St.)

To-date, most of the work has been the replacement of curbs and sidewalk ramps in preparation for the actual repaving work to follow. It is a federal requirement to upgrade non-ADA compliant curb ramps along roads that are resurfaced within the construction area limits.

9. COMMUNITY CROSSINGS GRANT

The request to INDOT to allocate the funds awarded has been initiated.

10. FORD RD./OAK ST. INTERSECTION PEDESTRIAN SIGNALS

Design is ongoing for the addition of two pedestrian signals at this intersection to complete access in all directions and legs of the intersection. Sidewalks will be added at the northeast corner of the intersection to connect to existing sidewalks in the area.

11. CR 700 PATHWAY

Negotiations continue with two property owners along this route, including the preparation of an appraisal to consider purchasing one of the properties in its entirety. Should either or both of these developments prove fruitful, land would then be available to the Town to move forward on full or at least partial construction. It is not likely that construction could begin yet this year, but an early 2017 start is more probable.

12. 4TH ST. DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT, PHASE I

A successful bid opening was held on September 22nd with four (4) contractors submitting on the project:

All bids have been reviewed and found to be complete, and it is the intent to enter into a contract with Atlas, Inc. as soon as two easements necessary for the project have been secured. The project cannot advance without modifications to existing ingress/egress easements at the south end of the project by naming them as drainage easements as well. No additional easement area is required, only modifications of the use to include drainage pipes.

13. 2016-2017 ROAD SALT PRICING

Through participation in the INDOT state-wide bid process for winter road salt, pricing for the coming winter season has dropped from \$81.01/ton last year to \$68.71 this year.

14. SEASONAL FALL LEAF COLLECTION

Curbside leaf collection for residents in the urban service district will begin the week of October 24th and run through December 2nd.

15. FALL 2016 BRUSH AND LIMB COLLECTION

The fall round of brush and limb collection for residents in the urban service district has been established. This information has been posted to the Town's web-site. Reminders will be provided to the Zionsville Times Sentinel as well as printed on upcoming sewer bills and details are provided at the end of this report.

Fall 2016 Brush & Limb Collection

The Town of Zionsville's Street & Stormwater Department will be providing curbside Brush & Limb Collection **beginning Monday, October 3, 2016**. This service provides Zionsville residents in the Urban district a means to dispose of certain pruning and yard debris. We cannot guarantee the collection unless your items are out curbside by 7:30 a.m. on your specific, designated pick-up day.

The limit on size is 6 inches in diameter and smaller. Grass clippings, leaves, decorative grass, vines, stumps, root balls, construction lumber, firewood, and wooden fencing material will **NOT** be collected. Bundling is not required. Limbs up to 6 inches in diameter may be left intact but should be no larger than can be managed by one person.
