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STREET AND STORMWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE, 2012

1. **STORMWATER PERMIT ACTIVITIES**

Routine inspections of eleven (11) Rule 5-permitted sites were conducted last month.

Interpretive signage has been developed for the completed rain garden that will educate Town Hall visitors on the purpose and intent of the project, and will be in production in August. This also contributes towards the requisite educational initiatives of the Town's NPDES stormwater permit.

Stormwater Manager participated in the Zion Nature Center's Creekstomp event where 77 children and their parents spent the afternoon in Eagle Creek learning about local wildlife and water quality.

2. **STORMWATER MANAGEMENT BOARD**

The Stormwater Utility Board adopted Resolution 2012-01 at their July meeting which makes several changes to the proposed stormwater utility fee rate structure. The rate amendments were developed in response to comments brought to the Board's attention by Town Council members, Town staff and Zionsville residents. There were four substantial changes to the rate which include charging all single family residences the same base monthly fee, exempting vacant parcels from the fee, implementing a three-year phase-in of the fee and adjusting the base fee from \$3.28 to \$3.86 to maintain the utility's projected funding needs. Consideration of this item will occur during the August Town Council meeting.

3. FIRST STREET PROJECT

Final revisions have been made to the design development plans, and meetings with previously identified individual business and property owners facing significant impacts are complete. However, additional meetings with subsequently identified individual property owners are still ongoing.

4. 2012 STREET REPAIRS

A bid opening was held on July 19th for this year's street repair program. Six (6) contractors submitted on the project as summarized below:

All bids were below the engineer's estimate, and therefore additional work is planned to be added to the contract, most likely yet-to-be-identified streets in the Colony Woods subdivision. All bids were accurate and complete, and a Notice of Award has been issued to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, E&B Paving. E&B has worked for the Town previously on the reconstruction and relocation of 106th St. Contract documents are being prepared and construction should begin later in August.
