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STREET AND STORMWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE, 2012

1. **STORMWATER PERMIT ACTIVITIES**

Routine inspections of thirteen (13) Rule 5-permitted sites were conducted last month.

Interpretive signage is in development for the completed rain garden that will educate Town Hall visitors on the purpose and intent of the project. This also contributes towards the requisite educational initiatives of the Town's NPDES stormwater permit. The garden was also featured on this year's Sullivan Munce Garden Tour attracting approximately 300 registrants.

Spill-Prevention and Emergency Response Plans have been finalized and implemented at all three fire stations, Wastewater Treatment Plant and Municipal Services Building.

The Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) has conducted a final inspection of the 401 WQC woody-reforestation mitigation site for the Willow Rd. realignment project. The site met permit compliance criteria for the third straight year and IDEM is expected to issue a letter releasing the Town from any future monitoring requirements

2. **STORMWATER MANAGEMENT BOARD**

The Stormwater Utility Board and Citizens' Advisory Committee met to discuss a proposed Stormwater Utility Implementation Plan that is designed to address concerns brought to the Board's attention by Town Council members, Town staff and Zionsville residents. The Board may vote on several components of the plan

at their July meeting which could include rate structure amendments aimed at simplifying and improving the proposed rate.

3. FIRST STREET PROJECT

Final revisions have been made to the design development plans, and meetings with individual business and property owners facing significant impacts are complete. Councilor Mundy, Town Manager Mitro and Superintendent Lantz met on June 27th to review the current design development plans. A subsequent meeting will be held with the other member of the working committee, Councilor Hopper, to allow her review and comment as well. Three additional properties were identified as meriting a personal review meeting, and will be conducted during the month of July, after which a final public information meeting will be scheduled.

4. 2012 STREET REPAIRS

This year’s street repair program will be advertised for bids the week of July 2nd with a bid opening scheduled for July 19th at 3:00 pm at the Town Hall. Streets and pathways currently included in the project are summarized in the following table:

The students intend to paint a lion's head, and have received approval from the Boone County Commissioners, owners of the bridge, to perform the work. It is expected that the students will be able to begin this work later in July.
