


Although most birders prefer to see warblers in beautiful breeding plumage each spring, fall is a great time to see these little jewels as well. Fall migration lasts longer and in general there are more individual birds to see. Sometimes the warblers' fall plumage makes them difficult to identify. Join local birding expert and Amos Butler Audubon Society president Rob Ripma in a two-part workshop to learn what you need to know to identify migrant warblers this fall.
