Re: 2024 Corrections Claims Register

Let me start off by saying, <u>these are not new claims</u>. They have already been approved throughout 2024. This list represents claims that have had a correction made for one reason or another. Corrections need to be presented to Council, more as a formality than anything. A few reasons a correction might be made are listed below.

- If a department reaches out and states that they should have paid an item from a different line (as long as the change makes sense), we make the correction.
- An actual input error.
- Encumbrances most of the time invoices that are tied to encumbrances start coming in for payment prior to us getting the year closed and encumbrances entered. In this case, once the encumbrances are entered, we have to void the original transaction and re-enter it tying the encumbrance to it. You will notice these on the report because they have a PO# listed in the PO column next to the transaction.
- An amount was input incorrectly. If the amount was less than what was originally approved, we void the transaction and input it correctly and make the payment. If the amount is more than what was originally approved, the payment is not made, and it would be re-presented in a Council meeting prior to payment being made (so it will not be on this list).
- A few things I will specifically point out on this report are:
 - Funds 2300 & 2301 these corrections took place due to separating out the donation funds for Fire & Park. Any transactions that had taken place were voided and moved to their new corresponding funds.
 - If a transaction must be voided and it has multiple line items, the entire transaction has to be re-entered, not just the line that is being corrected. This is

the case with the 12/20 payroll. There was an error on ADP's side with some taxes. The amount ended up being less than what was approved, but it affected a couple of lines. The entire Payroll entry (and its many lines) had to be voided and re-entered. That's the reason for all the 12/20 Payroll entries on the report. There are a few other instances where multiple line items were involuntarily involved with a transaction being corrected, but none as large as the payroll item.

Please keep in mind that even though this register is titled "2024 Corrections" these are not all due to errors being made. This is being presented for transparency and 2024 closeout.

ORDINANCE NO. 2024 -46 OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF ZIONSVILLE, INDIANA

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 33, TITLE III OF THE ZIONSVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REVISE REGULATIONS ON NEPOTISM

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Zionsville ("Town Council") previously adopted Ordinance 2012-10 (later amended by Ordinance 2023-30) which established regulations on nepotism; and

WHEREAS, Ind. Code § 36-1-20.2-9 allows the Town of Zionsville ("Town") to adopt regulations regarding nepotism that are more stringent or detailed then the Indiana Code; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has determined the need to clarify their nepotism policies to include boards and commission appointments; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has determined the need to clarify the state's conflict of interest policies apply to all Town public servants, as defined by Ind. Code 35-31.5-2-261; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has determined that such regulations are necessary to protect the integrity and productivity of the workforce of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has determined that amending the Zionsville Code of Ordinances to revise such regulations is a priority of the Town.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Town Council of the Town of Zionsville, Boone County, Indiana, meeting in regular session as follows:

Section 1. The forgoing Recitals are incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Title III, Chapter 33 of the Zionsville Town Code is hereby repealed in its entirety and replaced as follows:

"CHAPTER 33: NEPOTISM AND CONFLICT OF INTEREST

§ 33.01 Findings. The Town finds that it is necessary and desirous to adopt a policy of conduct regarding nepotism and conflicts of interest in the employment with and appointments to Boards, Commissions and Committees of the Town, and in contracting with the Town in order to continue to be able to provide local government services to its residents and to comply with the requirements of Ind. Code § 36-1-20.2 and Ind. Code § 36-1-21.

§ 33.02 Nepotism Policy Compliance with State Law.

(A) The Town shall have a nepotism and a contracting with the Town policy that complies with the minimum requirements of Ind. Code § 36-1-20.2 (hereinafter, "nepotism policy") and Ind. Code § 36-1-21 (hereinafter, "contracting with the Town by a relative policy").

- (B) The Town finds that both Ind. Code § 36-1-20.2 and Ind. Code 36-1-21 specifically allow a unit to adopt requirements that are more stringent or detailed as are necessary.
- (C) The Town further finds that a single member of the Town Council cannot act for the Council to make work assignments, compensation, grievances, advancement or performance evaluation decisions without prior authority of a majority of the Town Council and, therefore, without such authority, he or she will not be in the direct line of supervision. See, Ind. Code § 36-5-2-9.4.
- (D) The Town finds that a single member of certain Town affiliated governing bodies with authority over employees in the Town cannot act for the governing body to make work assignments, compensation, grievances, advancement or performance evaluation decisions without prior authority of a majority of the governing body, when a statute provides that a majority is needed to act and, therefore, without such authority, the single member will not be in the direct line of supervision. See, Ind. Code § 36-74-400 and Ind. Code § 36-10-3.

§ 33.03 Nepotism Policies Established.

- (A) The Town's nepotism policy is hereby established by adopting the minimum requirements of Ind. Code § 36-1-20.2 and including all future supplements and amendments thereto which become law from time to time and making them a part hereof as if fully set forth herein.
- (B) The Town's contracting with the Town by a relative policy is hereby established by adopting the minimum requirements of Ind. Code § 36-1-21 and including all future supplements and amendments thereto which become law from time to time and making them a part hereof as if fully set forth herein.
- (C) No relative, as defined by 36-1-20.2-8, of a current Town employee or elected official may be appointed to any Town board, commission or committee.

§ 33.04 Conflict of Interest Policies Established.

The Town's conflict of interest policy is hereby established by adopting the minimum requirements of Ind. Code § 35-44.1-1-4 and including all future supplements and amendments thereto which become law from time to time and making them a part hereof as if fully set forth herein. Further, no relative (as defined by 36-1-20.2-8) of any current Town employee or elected official shall be appointed to any Town board, commission or committee.

§ 33.05 Cooperation Required.

- (A) All elected and appointed officials and employees of the Town are hereby directed to cooperate fully in the implementation of the policies created by this chapter and demonstrating compliance with these policies.
- (B) Failure to abide by or cooperate with the implementation, compliance and certifications connected with the nepotism policy and the contracting with the Town by a relative policy is a violation and may result in the discipline, including termination, of an employee or a transfer from the direct line of supervision or other curative action. An elected or appointed official of the Town who fails to abide by or cooperate with the implementation, compliance and mandated certifications of either the nepotism policy or the contracting with the Town by a relative policy may be subject to action allowed by law.

§ 33.06 Implementation.

- (A) The policies created by this chapter are hereby directed to be implemented by any of the following actions:
 - 1) Posting a copy of this chapter, in its entirety, in at least one of the locations in the Town where it posts employer posters or other notices to its employees;
 - 2) Providing a copy of this chapter to its employees, and elected and appointed officials;
 - 3) Providing or posting a notice of the adoption of this chapter; or
 - 4) Any such other action or actions that would communicate the policies established by this chapter to its employees and elected and appointed officials.
- (B) Upon any of taking these actions, these policies are deemed implemented by the Town.
- § 33.07 Adoption of State Law. A copy of the provisions of Ind. Code § 36-1-20.2, Ind. Code § 36-1-21, Ind. Code § 35-44.1-1-4, effective 7-1-2024, are attached to the ordinance codified herein as Exhibits A, B, and C in their entirety. Two copies of Ind. Code § 36-1-20.2, Ind. Code § 36-1-21, and Ind. Code § 35-44.1-1-4, and as supplemented or amended, are on file in the office of the Mayor of the Town for public inspection as provided by Ind. Code § 36-1-5-4.
- § 33.08 <u>Duration and Effective Date</u>. The provisions of this chapter and the policies adopted are effective and in full force and effect until repeal by ordinance."
- <u>Section 3</u>: If any portion of this Ordinance is for any reason declared to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance so long as enforcement of same can be given the same effect.

<u>Section 4</u>: The provisions of this Ordinance shall take effect following the date of its passage and action by the Town Council and the Mayor in the manner prescribed by Reorganization section ZR2A18 and shall remain in full force and effect until amended or repealed by ordinance of the Town Council.

IC 35-44.1-1-1 Official misconduct

Sec. 1. A public servant who knowingly or intentionally:

- (1) commits an offense in the performance of the public servant's official duties;
- (2) solicits, accepts, or agrees to accept from an appointee or employee any property other than what the public servant is authorized by law to accept as a condition of continued employment;
- (3) acquires or divests himself or herself of a pecuniary interest in any property, transaction, or enterprise or aids another person to do so based on information obtained by virtue of the public servant's office that official action that has not been made public is contemplated; or
- (4) fails to deliver public records and property in the public servant's custody to the public servant's successor in office when that successor qualifies;

commits official misconduct, a Level 6 felony.

IC 35-44.1-1-2 Bribery

Sec. 2. (a) A person who:

- (1) confers, offers, or agrees to confer on a public servant, either before or after the public servant becomes appointed, elected, or qualified, any property, except property the public servant is authorized by law to accept, with intent to control the performance of an act related to the employment or function of the public servant or because of any official act performed or to be performed by the public servant, former public servant, or person selected to be a public servant;
- (2) being a public servant, solicits, accepts, or agrees to accept, either before or after the person becomes appointed, elected, or qualified, any property, except property the person is authorized by law to accept, with intent to control the performance of an act related to the person's employment or function as a public servant;
- (3) confers, offers, or agrees to confer on a person any property, except property the person is authorized by law to accept, with intent to cause that person to control the performance of an act related to the employment or function of a public servant;
- (4) solicits, accepts, or agrees to accept any property, except property the person is authorized by law to accept, with intent to control the performance of an act related to the employment or function of a public servant;
- (5) confers, offers, or agrees to confer any property on a person participating or officiating in, or connected with, an athletic contest, sporting event, or exhibition, with intent that the person will fail to use the person's best efforts in connection with that contest, event, or exhibition;

- (6) being a person participating in, officiating in, or connected with an athletic contest, sporting event, or exhibition, solicits, accepts, or agrees to accept any property with intent that the person will fail to use the person's best efforts in connection with that contest, event, or exhibition;
- (7) being a witness or informant in an official proceeding or investigation, solicits, accepts, or agrees to accept any property, with intent to:
 - (A) withhold any testimony, information, document, or thing;
 - (B) avoid legal process summoning the person to testify or supply evidence; or
 - (C) absent the person from the proceeding or investigation to which the person has been legally summoned;
- (8) confers, offers, or agrees to confer any property on a witness or informant in an official proceeding or investigation, with intent that the witness or informant:
 - (A) withhold any testimony, information, document, or thing;
 - (B) avoid legal process summoning the witness or informant to testify or supply evidence; or
 - (C) absent himself or herself from any proceeding or investigation to which the witness or informant has been legally summoned; or
- (9) confers or offers or agrees to confer any property on an individual for:
 - (A) casting a ballot or refraining from casting a ballot; or
- (B) voting for a political party, for a candidate, or for or against a public question; in an election described in IC 3-5-1-2 or at a convention of a political party authorized under IC 3;

commits bribery, a Level 5 felony.

(b) It is not a defense that the person whom the accused person sought to control was not qualified to act in the desired way.

IC 35-44.1-1-3 Ghost employment

commits ghost employment, a Level 6 felony.

- (b) A public servant who knowingly or intentionally assigns to an employee under the public servant's supervision any duties not related to the operation of the governmental entity that the public servant serves commits ghost employment, a Level 6 felony.
- (c) A person employed by a governmental entity who, knowing that the person has not been assigned any duties to perform for the entity, accepts property from the entity commits ghost employment, a Level 6 felony.
- (d) A person employed by a governmental entity who knowingly or intentionally accepts property from the entity for the performance of duties not related to the operation of the entity commits ghost employment, a Level 6 felony.
- (e) Any person who accepts property from a governmental entity in violation of this section and any public servant who permits the payment of property in violation of this section are jointly and severally liable to the governmental entity for that property. The attorney general may bring a civil action to recover that property in the county where the governmental entity is located or the person or public servant resides.
- (f) For the purposes of this section, an employee of a governmental entity who voluntarily performs services:
 - (1) that do not:
 - (A) promote religion;
 - (B) attempt to influence legislation or governmental policy; or
 - (C) attempt to influence elections to public office;

IC 35-44.1-1-4 Conflict of interest

Sec. 4. (a) The following definitions apply throughout this section:

- (1) "Dependent" means any of the following:
 - (A) The spouse of a public servant.
 - (B) A child, stepchild, or adoptee (as defined in IC 31-9-2-2) of a public servant who is:
 - (i) unemancipated; and
 - (ii) less than eighteen (18) years of age.
 - (C) An individual more than one-half (1/2) of whose support is provided during a year by the public servant.
- (2) "Governmental entity served by the public servant" means the immediate governmental entity being served by a public servant.
- (3) "Pecuniary interest" means an interest in a contract or purchase if the contract or purchase will result or is intended to result in an ascertainable increase in the income or net worth of:
 - (A) the public servant; or
 - (B) a dependent of the public servant who:
 - (i) is under the direct or indirect administrative control of the public servant; or
 - (ii) receives a contract or purchase order that is reviewed, approved, or directly or indirectly administered by the public servant.
- (b) A public servant who knowingly or intentionally:
 - (1) has a pecuniary interest in; or
 - (2) derives a profit from;

a contract or purchase connected with an action by the governmental entity served by the public servant commits conflict of interest, a Level 6 felony.

- (c) It is not an offense under this section if any of the following apply:
- (1) The public servant or the public servant's dependent receives compensation through salary or an employment contract for:
 - (A) services provided as a public servant; or
 - (B) expenses incurred by the public servant as provided by law.
- (2) The public servant's interest in the contract or purchase and all other contracts and purchases made by the governmental entity during the twelve (12) months before the date of the contract or purchase was two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) or less.
- (3) The contract or purchase involves utility services from a utility whose rate structure is regulated by the state or federal government.
- (4) The public servant:
 - (A) acts in only an advisory capacity for a state supported college or university; and
 - (B) does not have authority to act on behalf of the college or university in a matter involving a contract or purchase.
- (5) A public servant under the jurisdiction of the state ethics commission (as provided

- in IC 4-2-6-2.5) obtains from the state ethics commission, following full and truthful disclosure, written approval that the public servant will not or does not have a conflict of interest in connection with the contract or purchase under IC 4-2-6 and this section. The approval required under this subdivision must be:
 - (A) granted to the public servant before action is taken in connection with the contract or purchase by the governmental entity served; or
 - (B) sought by the public servant as soon as possible after the contract is executed or the purchase is made and the public servant becomes aware of the facts that give rise to a question of conflict of interest.
- (6) A public servant makes a disclosure that meets the requirements of subsection (d) or (e) and is:
 - (A) not a member or on the staff of the governing body empowered to contract or purchase on behalf of the governmental entity, and functions and performs duties for the governmental entity unrelated to the contract or purchase;
 - (B) appointed by an elected public servant;
 - (C) employed by the governing body of a school corporation and the contract or purchase involves the employment of a dependent or the payment of fees to a dependent;
 - (D) elected; or
 - (E) a member of, or a person appointed by, the board of trustees of a state supported college or university.
- (7) The public servant is a member of the governing board of, or is a physician employed or contracted by, a hospital organized or operated under IC 16-22-1 through IC 16-22-5 or IC 16-23-1.
- (d) A disclosure must:
 - (1) be in writing;
 - (2) describe the contract or purchase to be made by the governmental entity;
 - (3) describe the pecuniary interest that the public servant has in the contract or purchase;
 - (4) be affirmed under penalty of perjury;
 - (5) be submitted to the governmental entity and be accepted by the governmental entity in a public meeting of the governmental entity before final action on the contract or purchase;
 - (6) be filed within fifteen (15) days after final action on the contract or purchase with:
 - (A) the state board of accounts; and
 - (B) if the governmental entity is a governmental entity other than the state or a state supported college or university, the clerk of the circuit court in the county where the governmental entity takes final action on the contract or purchase; and
 - (7) contain, if the public servant is appointed, the written approval of the elected public servant (if any) or the board of trustees of a state supported college or university (if any) that appointed the public servant.
- (e) This subsection applies only to a person who is a member of, or a person appointed by, the board of trustees of a state supported college or university. A person to whom this subsection applies complies with the disclosure requirements of this chapter with respect to the person's pecuniary interest in a particular type of contract or purchase which is made on a regular basis from a particular vendor if the individual files with the state board of accounts and the board of trustees a statement of pecuniary interest in that particular type of contract or purchase made with that particular vendor. The statement required by this subsection must be made on an annual basis.

 - (1) obtains a pecuniary interest in a contract or purchase with an agency within one (1) year after separation from employment or other service with the agency; and
 - (2) is not a public servant for the agency but who as a public servant approved, negotiated, or prepared on behalf of the agency the terms or specifications of:
 - (A) the contract; or
 - (B) the purchase;

commits profiteering from public service, a Level 6 felony.

- (c) This section does not apply to negotiations or other activities related to an economic development grant, loan, or loan guarantee.
- (d) This section does not apply if the person receives less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) of the profits from the contract or purchase.
 - (e) It is a defense to a prosecution under this section that:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE SUBDIVISION CONTROL ORDINANCE FOR THE TOWN OF ZIONSVILLE, BOONE COUNTY, INDIANA

AND FIXING A TIME WHEN THE SAME SHALL TAKE EFFECT

Plan Commission Petition No. 2024-76-OA

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Zionsville, Boone County, Indiana (the "Town Council") desires to promote positive fiscal management of the community; and,

WHEREAS from time to time it is necessary to review and update the Town of Zionsville Subdivision Control Ordinance (the "SCO"); and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with Indiana Code § 36-7-4-700 *et seq.*, the Town of Zionsville Advisory Plan Commission, Boone County, Indiana (the "Plan Commission") conducted a public hearing on December 16, 2024, to consider a proposal to amend the SCO filed as petition 2024-76-OA; and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with Indiana Code § 36-7-4-600 *et seq.*, the Town of Zionsville Advisory Plan Commission, Boone County, Indiana (the "Plan Commission") conducted a public hearing on December 16, 2024, to consider a proposal to amend the SCO in the same manner as the zoning ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission certified the proposal to amend the SCO to the Town, with a Favorable recommendation by a vote of seven (7) in favor and zero (0) opposed on December 16, 2024 (Exhibit A); and,

WHEREAS, the Town Council considered the Proposal to amend the SCO at its regular meeting on January 6, 2025, and,

WHEREAS, the Town Council accepts the recommendation of the Plan Commission and has decided to adopt the proposed amendments to the SCO.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF ZIONSVILLE, BOONE COUNTY, INDIANA, IN ACCORDANCE WITH Ind. Code § 36 7-4-700 et seq. and § 36 7-4-600 et seq. AND ALL ACTS AMENDATORY AND SUPPLEMENTAL THERETO, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The forgoing recitals are incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Section 193.060 of the SCO is hereby amended as follows:

"§ 193.060 STREET LIGHTS AND STREET SIGNS; LANDSCAPING.

- (A) Street lights.
- (1) The subdivider shall provide the subdivision with street lights to be installed at subdivision entrance to perimeter streets, street intersections throughout the subdivision and spaced at intervals no greater than 600 linear feet and not less than 300 linear feet along a street or where deemed necessary by the town for security, health and safety purposes.
- (2) Street lighting plan shall be submitted for review and approval to the applicable electric utility prior to the review and approval by the Plan Commission as a part of the submittal of a primary plat.
- (3) The subdivider shall be responsible for the up-front payment to the applicable utility of all capitol costs associated with the purchase and installation of street lights. Ongoing maintenance costs including, but not limited to, bulb replacement, ballast replacement and painting charged by the applicable utility associated with street lights shall be the responsibility of either the subdivider or said costs shall be assigned to a homeowners' association by the subdivider when development is complete, as appropriate. Should painting/repainting not be included under a maintenance agreement with the applicable utility, the subdivider or homeowners' association shall be responsible for said repairs with the approval of the applicable utility. The subdivider or homeowners' association shall be responsible for the energy/electric bills for the operation of the street lights.
- (4) Street lights shall be pole mounted, either standard gooseneck/cobra arm with luminaire on pole or decorative post and luminaire, and shall conform to the installation specifications of the applicable electric utility.
- <u>Section 4.</u> Savings Clause: If any title, section, subsection, phrase, clause, sentence, or word of this Ordinance shall for any reason be held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.
- <u>Section 5.</u> Construction of Clause Headings: The clause headings appearing herein have been provided for convenience and reference and do not purport and shall not be deemed to define, limit or extend the scope or intent of the clause to which they pertain.
- <u>Section 6.</u> Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances: The provisions of all other Town ordinances in conflict with the provisions hereof, if any, are of no further force or effect and are hereby repealed.
- <u>Section 7.</u> Severability: If any part of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance.

On December 16, 2024, the Plan Commission heard Petition #2024-76-OA to amend Section 193.060(A) of the Town's Subdivision Control Ordinance. This section deals specifically with requirements for the provision of street lights within a subdivision; the required spacing of said lights; the approval of said lights; the maintenance of and costs related to the operation of said lights; the responsibility of replacement cost of said lights; and the general design of said lights. As currently written, the Section identifies the Town of Zionsville as the party responsible for the "energy/electric bills for the operation of the street lights" and the Town to be responsible for the replacement of a standard pole-mounted gooseneck/cobra arm light assembly.

The Commission forwarded a unanimous favorable recommendation to the Town Council. The Plan Commission certification is attached.

This proposal was initiated by town staff. Staff seeks approval to amend this section of the Subdivision Control Ordinance to remove the Town's responsibility for payment of the energy/electric bills and the costs of replacement of standard pole-mounted gooseneck/cobra arm light assembly. The proposed Town Council Ordinance amending Section 193.060(A) of the Town's Subdivision Control Ordinance is attached.

ORDINANCE NO. 2025 - 02 OF THE TOWN COUNCILOF THE TOWN OF ZIONSVILLE, INDIANA

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS, pursuant to Town Resolution 2014-11, Reorganization 2.0 ("Reorganization") and specifically provision ZR2A23, the Zionsville Town Council ("Town Council") may, upon recommendation from the Mayor, eliminate Town departments, combine Town departments and create new Town departments; and

WHEREAS, in order to promote internal and external economic development project coordination, operational transparency and best utilize the Town's resources of employees, the Mayor has recommended that the Town Council establish the Department of Economic Development as a new Town department; and

WHEREAS, the Deputy Mayor will supervise and manage the Department of Economic Development; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council hereby finds that it is in the public interest to establish the Department of Economic Development as an executive department of the Town.

NOW, THERFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Town Council of the Town of Zionsville, Indiana as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The foregoing Recitals are incorporated herein by this reference.

<u>Section 2.</u> Title III, Chapter 31, Section 31.31 is hereby added to the Town of Zionsville Code of Ordinances and shall read as follows:

"§ 31.31 DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The Department of Economic Development is supervised and managed by the Deputy Mayor and is responsible for fostering economic growth within the Town of Zionsville by attracting new businesses, retaining existing businesses, creating new jobs,

establishing public-private partnerships, and undertaking long-range economic development planning. The Department will work to coordinate the Town's economic development efforts with both internal and external stakeholders."

<u>Section 3</u>. <u>Severability</u>. If any part of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remainder of the Ordinance.

Section 4. <u>Duration and Effective Date.</u> The provisions of this Ordinance shall become and remain in full force and effect following the date of its passage and adoption and upon its signature by the Mayor in the manner prescribed by Ind. Code. § 36-5-2-l0(a) and shall remain in full force and effect until December 31, 2025, unless subsequently amended by ordinance.

<u>Section 2</u>: <u>Downtown DORA Amendment</u>. The Downtown DORA is hereby amended to include the property located at 10771 Creekside Way, Zionsville, Indiana 46077, as depicted on <u>Exhibits</u> A and B, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

<u>Section 3</u>: <u>Severability.</u> If any part of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remainder of the Ordinance.

Section 4: Duration and Effective Date. The provisions of this Ordinance shall take effect following the date of its passage and action by the Town Council and the Mayor in the manner prescribed by Reorganization section ZR2A18 and shall remain in full force and effect until amended or repealed by ordinance of the Town Council.





ORDINANCE NO. 2025-_05___ OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF ZIONSVILLE, INDIANA

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE IX, CHAPTER 93 OF THE ZIONSVILLE TOWN CODE

WHEREAS, in 2018, the Zionsville Town Council (the "Town Council") adopted a comprehensive smoking ban in private clubs (the "Smoking Ban") within the Town of Zionsville, Indiana (the "Town"); and

WHEREAS, in order to enhance economic activity within the Town, the Town Council desires to exempt cigar bars and cigar lounges from the Smoking Ban; and

WHEREAS, Ind. Code 7.1-5-12 allows for exceptions to smoking bans in certain private clubs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Town Council of the Town of Zionsville, Boone County, Indiana, meeting in regular session as follows:

Section 1. The forgoing Recitals are incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Title IX, Chapter 93, § 93.02 of the Zionsville Town Code is hereby amended to add the following definition:

"CIGAR LOUNGE. Cigar lounge means any Private Club, or area within a Private Club, designated specifically for the smoking of tobacco products that have been purchased or brought on the premises and that prohibits all persons under the legal age to lawfully smoke tobacco from entering the premises. A cigar lounge shall be an area enclosed by solid walls or windows, a ceiling and a solid door and equipped with a ventilation system which is separately exhausted from the nonsmoking areas of the Private Club so that air from the smoking area is not recirculated to the nonsmoking areas and smoke is not back-streamed into the nonsmoking areas."

Section 3. Title IX, Chapter 93, § 93.06 of the Zionsville Town Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"93.06 WHERE SMOKING AND TOBACCO ARE NOT REGULATED.

The prohibitions of § 93.04 of this chapter shall not apply to the following:

- (A) Private residences, except when used as a licensed childcare, adult day care or health care facility;
- (B) Hotel and motel rooms that are rented to guests and are designated as smoking rooms;
- (C) Designated rooms in nursing homes and other long-term care facilities in which residents only may smoke:
 - (D) Except as noted in § 93.03 above, any outdoor area; and
 - (E) Cigar Lounges as defined in this Chapter."

Section 4: If any portion of this Ordinance is for any reason declared to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance so long as enforcement of same can be given the same effect.

Section 5: The provisions of this Ordinance shall take effect following the date of its passage and action by the Town Council and the Mayor in the manner prescribed by Reorganization section ZR2A18 and shall remain in full force and effect until amended or repealed by ordinance of the Town Council.

History:

In 2015, the Town of Zionsville rezoned 75± acres of town-owned property to the Creekside Planned Unit Development ("Creekside PUD") under Docket #2015-02-Z. Revisions to the PUD ordinance occurred in 2016 (Docket #2016-16-Z), 2018 (Docket #2018-15-Z), 2020 (Docket #2020-15-Z), and most recently in 2022 (Docket #2022-60-Z).

At the January 21, 2025, regular meeting, the Plan Commission heard Petition #2024-74-Z, RFPDI LLC's request to amend the PUD ordinance, and forwarded a unanimous favorable recommendation to the Town Council.

Summary of Proposed Rezoning Ordinance Details:

The 75± acre Creekside Corporate Park PUD is divided into five subareas ("A", "B", "C", "D", & "E"), with each subarea having its list of permitted uses and development standards. This proposed PUD ordinance text amendment would revise the sign and architectural standards for Subarea "E".

The proposed text amendment changes the highly specific sign standards for Subarea "E" (Section 1.20, M) to a more generalized set of standards based on generic (non-specific) tenants and adds lighted accent bars as an architectural lighting option (Section 1.21, K). The proposal acknowledges current signage on the site and future signage needs. All other standards within the existing PUD ordinance would be unchanged. CURRENT CONDITIONS

- The west building (10850) has four (4) wall signs facing south towards 106th Street, identifying current tenants, Graham Rahal Performance, Graham Rahal Paint Projection (with logo), Ducati, and Rivet Coffee.
- The west building has three (3) wall signs for current tenants, Ducati, a service bay sign, a logo and a Rahal Paint Protection sign.
- The east building (10814) has three (3) wall signs facing south towards 106th Street including the existing brands of Piaggio, Vespa, Aprita, and Moto Guzzer (Piaggio). Planned signs are for the restaurant use, Bowdies, the social club, Wheelhouse, and a projecting sign for Piaggio.





CURRENT CONDITIONS (Continued)

- The east building has four (4) wall signs on the east façade one (1) each for the four (4) brands. These signs, taken together, are treated as one (1) sign. There is a potential sign on the east façade for Rahal Car Storage.
- While there are no signs on the north façade, there is a potential sign for Rahal Car Storage which has tenant space along the north façade.






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SUMMARY

ORDINANCE NO. <u>2025-</u> OF THE TOWN OF ZIONSVILLE, INDIANA

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE TOWN OF ZIONSVILLE ZONING ORDINANCE FOR THE TOWN OF ZIONSVILLE, BOONE COUNTY, INDIANA

AND FIXING A TIME WHEN THE SAME SHALL TAKE EFFECT

Plan Commission Petition No. 2024-74-Z

WHEREAS, I.C. §36-7-4, et seq. empowers the Town of Zionsville Advisory Plan Commission, Boone County, Indiana, to hold public hearings and make recommendations to the Town Council of the Town of Zionsville, Boone County, Indiana, concerning ordinances for the zoning and districting of all lands within the incorporated areas of the Town of Zionsville, Boone County, Indiana; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with IC. 36-7-4-600 et seq. the Town of Zionsville Advisory Plan Commission, Boone County, Indiana conducted a public hearing on January 21, 2025 to consider a proposal to amend the Creekside Corporate Park Planned Unit Development (PUD) for the Town of Zionsville, Boone County, Indiana, (the "Ordinance") filed as petition 2024-74-Z (the "Petition"); and

WHEREAS, the Town of Zionsville Advisory Plan Commission, by a vote of seven (7) in favor and zero (0) opposed, has certified its favorable recommendation on this ordinance text amendment to the Town Council of the Town of Zionsville, Boone County, Indiana, on January 21, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Zionsville, Boone County, Indiana, considered the Petition to amend the PUD Ordinance at its regular meeting on February 3, 2025.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF ZIONSVILLE, BOONE COUNTY, INDIANA, IN ACCORDANCE WITH I.C. 36-7-4 - 600 et. seq., AND ALL ACTS AMENDATORY AND SUPPLEMENTAL THERETO, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Creekside Corporate Park PUD ordinance for the Town of Zionsville Boone County, Indiana, is amended as follows:

- A. The subject site consists of 9.4 +/- acres legally described in the attached Exhibit A and depicted on Exhibit B for the Creekside Corporate Park PUD.
- B. The proposed text amendments are detailed within the Creekside Corporate Park Planned Unit Development, attached hereto as <u>Exhibit C</u>.

<u>Section 2</u>. <u>Conditions and Commitments</u>. The Petition and this rezoning are subject to the written commitments attached hereto if any.

<u>Section 3</u>. Savings Clause: If any title, section, subsection, phrase, clause, sentence, or word of this Ordinance shall for any reason beheld invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>Section 4</u>. Construction of Clause Headings: The clause headings appearing herein have been provided for convenience and reference and do not purport and shall not be deemed to define, limit or extend the scope or intent of the clause to which they appertain.

<u>Section 5</u>. Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances: The provisions of all other Town ordinances in conflict with the provisions hereof, if any, are of no further force or effect and are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 6</u>. Severability: If any part of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance.

<u>Section 7</u>. **Duration and Effective Date**: The provisions of this Ordinance shall become and remain in full force and effect upon adoption and publication according to Indiana Law and until its repeal by ordinance.



1.1 Intent

The intent of Creekside Corporate Park is to:

- A. Develop sensitively, providing a transition from the industrial zoning to the east to the village zoning to the west and northwest.
- B. Reasonably develop responsibly, preserving the terrain and prime natural amenities that exist on the site.
- C. Enhance the gateway into Zionsville via 106th Street.
- D. Set the benchmark for undeveloped or under-developed land along 106th Street.
- E. Not require each developable lot to have its own open space, but instead preserving the ravines for aesthetic and recreation purposes.
- F. Not require each developable lot to have stormwater detention basins, but instead utilizing low impact development techniques to meet stormwater regulations.
- G. Allow land uses that will complement the region, add high quality jobs, and encourage higher quantity of jobs per square foot of building space.
- H. Allow complementary support businesses that are subordinate to the primary permitted uses; and
- I. Provide a trail network for recreation and pedestrian transportation purposes, allowing employees an expedited route to South Main and the Village.

1.2 Applicable Land

See Exhibit A for the boundaries of the Creekside Corporate Park PUD. Exhibit A shows a conceptual location for an internal street and internal curb cuts. The exact design, length and alignment of this route is subject to change upon further engineering study.

Exhibit A – Creekside Corporate Park PUD Boundary



1.3 Subareas of the Creekside Corporate Park PUD

- A. <u>Subarea A</u>: Subarea A represents one of the districts on which the principal uses would be constructed. See Subarea A on Exhibit B.
- B. <u>Subarea B</u>: Subarea B is the smallest district and is isolated from Subarea A by natural areas. Because this subarea fronts a future rail-trail and 106th Street and because of lot size limitations, it is believed to be significantly different than Subarea A. See Subarea B on Exhibit B.
- C. <u>Subarea C</u>: Subarea C is predominantly the ravines and conservation areas being set aside for aesthetic, recreation and storm water confluence purposes. See Subarea C on Exhibit B.
- D. <u>Subarea D</u>: Subarea D is the largest district and represents the land on which the principal uses would be constructed. See Subarea D on Exhibit B.
- E. <u>Subarea E:</u> Subarea E is the NW corner of 106th Street and Creek Way and represents the land on which the principal uses would be constructed. See Subarea E on Exhibit B.
- F. <u>Delineation</u>: The exact delineation between subareas is subject to change upon further engineering and environ- mental study. Subarea A may increase by up to 10% and subarea B may increase by up to 30%. Both Subareas A and B may be decreased by as much as 55%




Exhibit B - Subareas of the Creekside Corporate Park PUD

1.9 Interpretation of Land Uses

- A. <u>Uses Not Listed</u>: Any use not listed shall be considered not permitted. However, uses that are significantly similar and of no greater intensity or impact may be considered a permitted use or accessory use by the Zoning Administrator. For example: a frozen yogurt shop is not specifically permitted in Section 1.04, but Ice Cream Shop is permitted. Therefore, the Zoning Administrator may interpret a yogurt shop as a permitted use because it is significantly similar and of no greater intensity or impact than an ice cream shop.
- B. <u>Ancillary Uses</u>: Uses that are clearly subordinate, customary, and incidental to a permitted use or accessory use shall also be permitted when it is otherwise in full compliance with the Creekside Corporate Park PUD. A good example is a retail store or a corporate fitness center for employee use with a parking lot. The parking lot and fitness center would be an ancillary use.

1.10 Development Standards for Subarea A

- A. <u>Review and Approval Authorization</u>: The development standards listed below shall be subject to Zoning Administrator review and approval in perpetuity.
- B. <u>Variances</u>: Any variance to the below listed development standards shall be considered by the Zionsville Board of Zoning Appeals.
- C. <u>Minimum Lot Width</u>: 50 feet; 30 feet for lots connecting with the Creek Way cul-de-sac. Minimum lot width shall be measured at the Minimum Front Yard Setback.
- D. <u>Minimum Lot Frontage</u>: 50 feet on a Public Street or Private Street; 20 feet for lots connecting with the Creek Way cul-de-sac. Minimum lot width shall be measured at the right-of-way line.
- E. Minimum Front Yard Setbacks: Measured from the right-of-way.
 - 1. From Internal Public or Private Streets: 30 feet for buildings, 15 feet for parking lots.
- F. Maximum Building Setback: Measured from the right-of-way.
 - 1. From Internal Public or Private Streets: Not applicable.
- G. Minimum Side and Rear Yard Setback: Measured from the lot lines.
 - 1. Minimum Side Yard: 30 feet for buildings, 5 feet for parking lots.
 - 2. *Minimum Rear Yard*: 30 feet for buildings, 10 feet for parking lots and where adjacent to Subarea C.
 - 3. *Minimum Property Boundary Setback*: The minimum building setback from the rear property line, adjacent to single-family residential, shall be forty (40) feet; and the minimum parking lot setback from the rear property line, adjacent to single-family residential, shall be thirty (30) feet.
- H. Maximum Height: 60 feet for all buildings, provided that the minimum required setbacks be increased by one-half (1/2) foot for each one (1) foot of building height above forty-five (45) feet.
- I. Off-Street Parking: See the Zionsville Zoning Ordinance, as amended.
- J. Off-Street Loading: Shall be limited to two (2) truck loading bays for buildings over 20,000 main floor square feet and one (1) bay for buildings between 8,000 and 20,000 main floor square feet. Buildings smaller than 8,000 square feet are not permitted truck loading bays. Any building that is not able to locate truck loading bays in a non-conspicuous facade or otherwise aesthetically shield them from view from a Public Street shall not be permitted truck loading bays.
- K. Wall Signs for Single-Tenant Buildings and Multiple-Tenant Buildings with Interior Entrances: The following provision applies to single-tenant buildings and multiple-tenant buildings that have

entrances off of interior hallways. Each facade facing a Public Street may have one (1) wall sign above a featured main entrance, in the parapet at the top of the building, or in an architecturally designed location on the front façade. Under no circumstance shall more than two (2) wall signs be permitted on one (1) primary structure. Wall signs shall be limited by one of the following:

- 1. Large Front Facade (parapet): Maximum of 120 square feet of sign area for front facades greater than 4,000 square feet when the sign is located along a parapet at the top edge of the building.
- 2. *Large Front Facade (above entrance)*: Maximum of 80 square feet of sign area for front facades greater than 4,000 square feet when located above a featured main entrance.
- 3. *Small Front Facade (parapet)*: 3% of the total front facade area shall be the maximum square feet of sign area. This standard applies to front building facades less than 4,000 square feet in area.
- 4. *Small Front Facade (above entrance)*: 2% of the total front facade area shall be the maximum square feet of sign area for a sign located above a featured main entrance. This standard applies to front building facades less than 4,000 square feet in area.
- 5. Façade Visible from West 106th Street (oriented to rear yard): shall be permitted to be improved with a rear facing sign not exceeding 12 square feet in size (being illuminated or non-illuminated).
- L. Wall Signs for Multiple-Tenant Buildings with Exterior Entrances: The following provision applies to multiple- tenant buildings with entrances to tenant spaces from the exterior. Each tenant with an exterior entrance may have one (1) wall sign limited to thirty (30) square feet, or one (1) foot of sign area per lineal foot of tenant frontage, whichever is greater. Each tenant sign shall be located in a space designed for wall signs above that tenant's entrance.
- M. <u>Ground Signs</u>: Ground Signs are not permitted by right. See the Architectural and Landscape Requirements for Subarea A in the next section for consideration of ground signs.
- N. Screening Requirements: Parcels adjacent to the Williams Glen apartment complex shall be required to install screening along the common property line, and within twenty (20) feet of that property line. Landscaping shall consist of native canopy tree species planted at a rate of one tree per forty (40) feet of contiguous boundary. The spacing of those trees should be irregular such to create a natural looking buffer. Therefore, the minimum spacing shall be twenty (20) feet and maximum spacing sixty (60) feet.
- O. Outside Storage and Operations: Not permitted
- P. <u>Pedestrian Connectivity</u>: All buildings shall have a pedestrian/bikeway system in compliance with the following requirements:
 - 1. *Sidewalk Connection*: A minimum six (6) foot wide sidewalk shall functionally and efficiently connect the primary building entries with the public sidewalk or path system.
 - 2. Internal Trail System Connection: Any lot which abuts the internal trail system located in Subarea C shall provide a connection between those trails and the building. Said connection shall be a sidewalk or otherwise improved path, allowing a connection for pedestrians and bicyclists. If the internal trail system in Subarea C has not yet been installed, this requirement may be delayed up until the internal trail system is built. Upon its completion, the adjacent property owner shall be required to install their connection within six (6) months.

1.11 Architecture and Landscape Architecture Requirements for Subarea A:

- A. Review and Approval Authorization: The architecture of all initial buildings shall be subject to the Creekside Committee review and approval. The details of an approved project shall be written into the purchase agreement for the land being sold. Changes to a pre-existing building after the initial construction (e.g., an addition facade alteration, or the like) shall be reviewed by the Creekside Committee or the Zionsville Redevelopment Commission if the Creekside Committee is no longer in effect.
- B. <u>Interpretation and Application of Guidelines</u>: The Creekside Committee will interpret and determine the applicability of the below guidelines to each project. The Creekside Committee will strive for

architecture and site improvements that are high quality, timeless, appropriate for a gateway into downtown Zionsville, and that create a development-wide aesthetic character.

C. <u>Building Height Guidelines</u>:

- 1. Any building is preferred to be two (2) stories or more. However, buildings partially or fully within sixty (60) feet of the northern property line and adjacent to single-family residential lots, shall be no greater than two (2) stories.
- D. <u>Building Size Guidelines</u>: A high floor area ratio (FAR) is desired. It is the desire of this development to fully utilize each parcel and to not allow land to be wasted. Green space beyond setbacks, parking lot islands, screening and buffering is discouraged (because the overall development is intended to have a large percentage of greenspace, trails, and park amenities). Similarly, an unnecessarily large parking lot is not desired.
 - E. <u>Building Facade Guidelines</u>: Any new building or building addition shall have the following characteristics and features:
 - 1. Any building shall have high architectural standards, however only the facades and building features clearly visible from Creek Way (the internal street) are required to meet that standard.
 - 2. Facades that Face Residential Uses: Any building facade facing Williams Glen Apartments or single-family residential lots to the north shall have a high degree of architectural character as to be a good neighbor to that residential use. This provision shall not apply if the building is greater than 150 feet from the applicable property line.
 - F. <u>Building Material Guidelines</u>: In order to create variation and interest in the built environment, all new buildings or building additions shall:
 - 1. Utilize at least two (2) building materials; excluding: windows (e.g., glass and frames), doors, and roofing material.
 - 2. The primary exterior material for any facade visible from 106th Street shall be one of the following:
 - a. brick,
 - b. architectural concrete that is colored and textured to closely resemble brick or stone,
 - c. External Insulation and Finish System (E.I.F.S.), or
 - d. stone.
 - 3. The primary exterior material for any facade not visible from 106th Street shall be one of the following:
 - a. brick,
 - b. wood,
 - c. fiber cement,
 - d. architectural concrete that is colored and textured to closely resemble brick or stone,
 - e. External Insulation and Finish System (E.I.F.S.), or
 - f. stone.

G. Roof Guidelines:

- 1. Pitched Roof: Pitched roofs shall only be permitted on smaller lots toward the rear of the development. Pitched roofs shall be simply and symmetrically pitched and only in the configuration of gables and hips, with pitches ranging from 5:12 to 12:12. Pitched roofs shall be clad in architectural, dimensional shingles or raised seam metal when done so for rainwater collection or other green building practice. Roof color shall be complementary to the design of the building. The Creekside Committee may approve additional material that clearly satisfies the intent of this subsection, and that is complementary of the building's architecture.
- 2. Shed Roofs: Shed roofs are generally not permitted

- 3. *Flat Roofs*: Flat roofs are permitted when consistent with the selected style of architecture, and if the top edge of the facade has some adornment or architectural character. Green roofs are permitted. Additionally, any rooftop mechanical equipment shall be reasonably screened.
- 4. *Roof Design*: In no case shall rooftop mechanical equipment be visible from 106th Street. All vents, attic ventilators, turbines, flues and other roof penetrations shall also be discrete.
- H. Entrance Guidelines: The main building or tenant space pedestrian entrances shall be defined and articulated by architectural elements such as lintels, pediments, pilasters, columns, and other design elements appropriate to the selected architectural style and details of the building as a whole. The location, orientation, proportion and style of doors shall reflect the chosen style of the building.
- I. <u>Window Guidelines</u>: All window designs shall be compatible with the style, materials, color, details and proportion of the building. All facades of a building shall have windows.
- J. Awning and Canopy Guidelines: Shall be the discretion of the Creekside Committee.

K. Lighting Guidelines:

- 1. *Shielding*: Any exterior lighting on any site shall be shielded to prevent light pollution (i.e., skyward) and light trespass (i.e., shining toward neighbors).
- 2. *Height*: The maximum height of any light fixtures, whether freestanding or mounted on a facade, for illumination of the site shall be twenty (20) feet.
- 3. Consistency: Light standards and fixtures on any lot, including free-standing light fixtures, those attached to buildings, security lights, and architectural lights, shall be of consistent design and material. Additionally, parking lot lights shall be of uniform size and height.
- 4. Facade illumination or sign lighting shall be carefully directed and shielded so that the light element is not visible from points along an adjacent public Right- of-Way.
- L. <u>Loading Dock Guidelines</u>: Loading docks shall not face 106th Street or the internal street, be visible from 106th Street, be visible from Williams Glen Apartments or the single-family residential lots to the north, or otherwise be a visual nuisance from an adjacent building.
- M. <u>Landscaping Guidelines</u>: Plants and hardscaping elements shall be chosen and installed to accomplish the following:
 - 1. General Aesthetic: To generally enhance the overall character of the site.
 - 2. *Screen Headlights*: To screen the headlights of cars from shining onto adjacent residential properties, and onto 106th Street and the internal street.
 - 3. Relieve Heat Island Effect: To utilize trees in and/or adjacent to parking lots to provide shade and aesthetic relief, especially in large parking lots. At least one landscape island shall be established per sixty (60) parking spaces, and at least one canopy or ornamental tree shall be planted in said island. Landscape islands shall be at least nine (9) feet square.
- N. <u>Bufferyard</u>: Lots adjacent to the northern property line adjacent to single-family residential lots shall install plant material, and/or a fence or wall for effective buffering. The Creekside Committee shall be responsible for approval of buffering proposals and may participate in the design discussions prior to submittal for approval.
- O. <u>Ground Sign Guidelines</u>: Ground signs are generally discouraged. However, a development-wide internal way- finding system utilizing high-quality sign materials is encouraged where appropriate.

1.12 Low Impact Development for Subarea A:

- A. <u>Parking Lot Design</u>: Parking lots shall be designed using low impact development best practices to reduce, absorb, and filter storm water rather than pipe it to a retention pond or other outlet. The use of french drains, cisterns, brick pavers, pervious pavement, rain gardens, swales, vaults, and the like should be considered.
- B. <u>Stormwater Runoff from a Building</u>: The impervious surface created by a building should be offset through utilization of green roofs, pervious sidewalks, brick pavers, rain gardens, rain barrels, cisterns, swales, selection of plant material, and the like.

C. <u>Retention Pond/Detention Basin</u>: Retention ponds are strongly discouraged. Short-term detention basins are supported.

1.13 Development Standards for Subarea B

- A. Minimum Lot Width: 50 feet
- B. Minimum Lot Frontage: 50 feet on a Public Street or Private Street.
- C. <u>Minimum Front Yard Setbacks</u>: 20 feet for buildings and ten (10) feet for parking lots, measured from the right-of-way.
- D. Maximum Building Setback: 60 feet for buildings measured from the right-of-way.
- E. Minimum Side and Rear Yard Setback: Measured from the lot lines.
 - 1. *Minimum Side Yard*: 10 feet for buildings, 10 feet for parking lots, and 5 feet for an outdoor patio or dining area adjacent to the rail-trail easement.
 - 2. Minimum Rear Yard: 10 feet for buildings, 10 feet for parking lots.
- F. Maximum Front Yard Parking Lot: Any parking lot located between the front building line and 106th Street's right- of-way shall be limited to either a single loaded parking area or a double loaded parking area, served by not more than one (1) interior access drive or aisle, and where the interior access drive or aisle is located generally parallel to the street right-of-way.
- G. Maximum Height: 40 feet and two (2) stories for all buildings.
- H. Off-Street Parking: See the Zionsville Zoning Ordinance, as amended.
- I. Off-Street Loading: Not permitted.
- J. Wall Signs for Single-Tenant Buildings and Multiple-Tenant Buildings with Interior Entrances: The following provision applies to single-tenant buildings and multiple-tenant buildings that have entrances off of interior hallways. Each facade facing a Public Street or side facade facing a parking lot may have one (1) wall sign. Each wall signs shall be limited to 60 square feet of sign area.
- K. Wall Signs for Multiple-Tenant Buildings with Exterior Entrances: The following provision applies to multiple- tenant buildings with entrances to tenant spaces from the exterior. Each tenant with an exterior entrance may have one (1) wall sign limited to thirty (30) square feet, or one (1) foot of sign area per lineal foot of tenant frontage, whichever is greater. Each tenant sign shall be located in a space designed for wall signs above that tenant's entrance.
- L. <u>Ground Signs</u>: Ground Signs are not permitted by right. See the Architectural and Landscape Requirements for Subarea B in the next section for consideration of ground signs.
- M. Screening Requirements: Not required.
- N. Outside Storage and Operations: Not permitted.
- O. <u>Pedestrian Connectivity</u>: All buildings shall have a pedestrian/bikeway system in compliance with the following requirements:
 - 1. Sidewalk Connection: A minimum six (6) foot wide sidewalk shall functionally and efficiently connect the primary building entries with the public path system along 106th Street
 - 2. Internal Trail System Connection: Any lot which abuts the internal trail system located in Subarea C shall provide a connection between those trails and the building. Said connection shall be a sidewalk or otherwise improved path, allowing a connection for pedestrians and bicyclists. If the internal trail system in Subarea C has not yet been installed, this requirement may be delayed up until the internal trail system is built. Upon its completion, the adjacent property owner shall be required to install their connection within six (6) months.

1.14 Architectural and Landscaping Requirements for Subarea B:

- A. Review and Approval Authorization: The architecture of all initial buildings shall be subject to the Creekside Committee review and approval. The details of an approved project shall be written into the purchase agreement for the land being sold. Changes to a pre-existing building after the initial construction (e.g., an addition, facade alteration, or the like) shall be reviewed by the Creekside Committee or the Zionsville Redevelopment Commission if the Creekside Committee is no longer in effect.
- B. <u>Interpretation and Application of Guidelines</u>: The Creekside Committee will interpret and determine the applicability of the below guidelines to each project. The Creekside Committee will strive for architecture and site improvements that are high quality, timeless, appropriate for a gateway into downtown Zionsville, and that create a development-wide aesthetic character.
- C. Overall Architectural Guidelines: The building or buildings constructed in Subarea B should be complementary to new developments on South Main Street and/or the Village. The building should be pedestrian scale and welcoming. The inside of the ground floor space should be visible and welcoming from 106th Street.
- D. Building Height Guidelines: A building shall be two (2) stories.
- E. <u>Building Size Guidelines</u>: A high floor area ratio (FAR) is desired. It is the desire of this development to fully utilize each parcel and to not allow land to be wasted. Green space beyond setbacks, parking lot islands, screening and buffering is discouraged (because the overall development is intended to have a large percentage of greenspace, trails, and park amenities). Similarly, an unnecessarily large parking lot is not desired.
- F. <u>Building Facade Guidelines</u>: Any building shall utilize four-sided architecture such that all facades and building features are highly detailed and aesthetic. This area is visible from multiple directions (assuming a rail-trial is constructed along the former interurban line) and shall be held to the highest standard in the Creekside Corporate Park.
- G. <u>Building Material Guidelines</u>: In order to create variation and interest in the built environment, all new buildings or building additions shall:
 - 1. Utilize at least two (2) building materials; excluding: windows (e.g., glass and frames), doors, and roofing material.
 - 2. The primary exterior material for any facade visible from 106th Street shall be one of the following:
 - a. brick,
 - b. wood,
 - c. fiber cement,
 - d. External Insulation and Finish System (E.I.F.S.), or
 - e. stone.

H. Roof Guidelines:

- 1. *Pitched Roof*: Pitched roofs are permitted. Such roofs should be symmetrically pitched and only in the configuration of gables and hips, with pitches ranging from 5:12 to 12:12. Pitched roofs shall be clad in architectural, dimensional shingles or raised seam metal when done so for rainwater collection or other green building practice. Roof color shall be complementary to the design of the building.
- 2. Shed or Gambrel Roofs: Shed or gambrel roofs are generally not permitted.
- 3. *Flat Roofs*: Flat roofs are permitted when consistent with the selected style of architecture, and if the top edge of the facade has some adornment or architectural character. Additionally, any rooftop mechanical equipment shall be reasonably screened.
- 4. *Roof Design*: In no case shall rooftop mechanical equipment be visible from 106th Street. All vents, attic ventilators, turbines, flues and other roof penetrations shall also be discrete.

- I. <u>Entrance Guidelines</u>: The main building and/or tenant space pedestrian entrances shall be defined and articulated by architectural elements such as lintels, pediments, pilasters, columns, and other design elements appropriate to the selected architectural style and details of the building as a whole. The location, orientation, proportion and style of doors shall reflect the chosen style of the building.
- J. <u>Window Guidelines</u>: All window designs shall be compatible with the style, materials, color, details and proportion of the building. All facades of the building shall have windows.
- K. Awning and Canopy Guidelines: Shall be the discretion of the Creekside Committee.
- L. Outdoor Dining: Is encouraged for food service uses.

M. Lighting Guidelines:

- 1. *Shielding*: Any exterior lighting on any site shall be shielded to prevent light pollution (i.e., skyward) and light trespass (i.e., shining toward neighbors).
- 2. *Height*: The maximum height of any light fixtures, whether freestanding or mounted on a facade, for illumination of the site shall be twenty (20) feet.
- 3. Consistency: Light standards and fixtures on any lot, including free-standing light fixtures, those attached to buildings, security lights, and architectural lights, shall be of consistent design and material. Additionally, parking lot lights shall be of uniform size and height.
- 4. Facade illumination or sign lighting shall be carefully directed and shielded so that the light element is not visible from points along an adjacent public Right-of-Way.
- N. Loading Docks: Loading docks shall not be permitted.
- O. <u>Landscaping</u>: Plants and hardscaping elements shall be chosen and installed to accomplish the following:
 - 1. General Aesthetic: To generally enhance the overall character of the site.
 - 2. *Screen Headlights*: To screen the headlights of cars from shining onto adjacent office properties and onto 106th Street.
 - 3. *Relieve Heat Island Effect*: To utilize trees in and/or adjacent to parking lots to provide shade and aesthetic relief, especially in large parking lots.
- P. Ground Sign Guidelines: One (1) ground sign may be permitted by the Creekside Committee if deemed necessary and fitting of the character. If permitted, the ground sign shall be limited to five (5) feet in height, thirty (30) square feet in area and landscaped around the base. The sign may be internally illuminated but shall be done so with the minimal amount of light necessary to read the sign.

1.15 Low Impact Development for Subarea B:

- A. <u>Parking Lot Design</u>: Parking lots shall be designed using low impact development best practices to reduce, absorb, and filter storm water rather than pipe it to a retention pond or other outlet. The use of french drains, cisterns, brick pavers, pervious pavement, rain gardens, swales, vaults, and the like should be considered.
- B. <u>Stormwater Runoff from a Building</u>: The impervious surface created by a building should be offset through utilization of green roofs, pervious sidewalks, brick pavers, rain gardens, rain barrels, cisterns, swales, selection of plant material, and the like.
- C. <u>Retention Pond/Detention Basin</u>: Retention ponds are strongly discouraged. Short-term detention basins are supported.

1.16 Development Standards for Subarea C

- A. Minimum Lot Width: Not required.
- B. Minimum Lot Frontage: Not required.
- C. Minimum Front Yard Setbacks: 5 feet for all structures.
- D. Maximum Building Setback: Not applicable.
- E. Minimum Side and Rear Yard Setback:
 - 1. Minimum Side Yard: 5 feet for all structures.
 - 2. Minimum Rear Yard: 5 feet for all structures.
- F. Maximum Front Yard Parking Lot: Not applicable.
- G. Maximum Height: 16 feet for all structures.
- H. Off-Street Parking: Not required.
- I. Off-Street Loading: Not permitted.
- J. <u>Wall Signs for Single-Tenant Buildings and Multiple-Tenant Buildings with Interior Entrances:</u> None permitted.
- K. Wall Signs for Multiple-Tenant Buildings with Exterior Entrances: None Permitted.
- L. Screening Requirements: Not required.
- M. Outside Storage and Operations: Not permitted.
- N. <u>Pedestrian Connectivity</u>: A minimum six (6) foot wide sidewalk shall functionally and efficiently connect the primary amenities to the public pedestrian facilities along the internal street.

1.17 Development Standards for Subareas D

- A. <u>Review and Approval Authorization</u>: The development standards listed below shall be subject to Zoning Administrator review and approval in perpetuity.
- B. <u>Variances</u>: Any variance to the below listed development standards shall be considered by the Zionsville Board of Zoning Appeals.
- C. <u>Minimum Lot Width</u>: 50 feet; 30 feet for lots connecting with the Creek Way cul-de-sac. Minimum lot width shall be measured at the Minimum Front Yard Setback.
- D. <u>Minimum Lot Frontage</u>: 50 feet on a Public Street or Private Street; 20 feet for lots connecting with the Creek Way cul-de-sac. Minimum lot width shall be measured at the right-of-way line.
- E. Minimum Front Yard Setbacks: Measured from the right-of-way.
 - 1. From 106th Street: 40 feet for buildings, 20 feet for parking lots.
 - 2. From Internal Public or Private Streets: 30 feet for buildings, 15 feet for parking lots.
- F. Maximum Building Setback: Measured from the right-of-way.
 - 1. From 106th Street: 120 feet for buildings.
 - 2. From Internal Public or Private Streets: Not applicable.
- G. Minimum Side and Rear Yard Setback: Measured from the lot lines.
 - 1. Minimum Side Yard: 30 feet for buildings, 5 feet for parking lots.
 - 2. *Minimum Rear Yard*: 30 feet for buildings, 10 feet for parking lots and where adjacent to Subarea C.
 - 3. *Minimum Property Boundary Setback*: The minimum building setback from the rear property line, adjacent to single-family residential, shall be forty (40) feet; and the minimum parking lot setback from the rear property line, adjacent to single-family residential, shall be thirty (30) feet.
- H. Maximum Front Yard Parking Lot: Any parking lot located between the front building line and 106th Street's right- of-way shall be limited to either a single loaded parking area or a double loaded parking area, served by not more than one (1) interior access drive or aisle, and where the interior access drive or aisle is located generally parallel to the street right-of-way.

- I. <u>Maximum Height</u>: 60 feet for all buildings, provided that the minimum required setbacks be increased by one-half (1/2) foot for each one (1) foot of building height above forty-five (45) feet.
- J. Off-Street Parking: See the Zionsville Zoning Ordinance, as amended.
- K. Off-Street Loading: Shall be limited to two (2) truck loading bays for buildings over 20,000 main floor square feet and one (1) bay for buildings between 8,000 and 20,000 main floor square feet. Buildings smaller than 8,000 square feet are not permitted truck loading bays. Any building that is not able to locate truck loading bays in a non-conspicuous facade or otherwise aesthetically shield them from view from a Public Street shall not be permitted truck loading bays.
- L. Wall Signs for Single-Tenant Buildings and Multiple-Tenant Buildings with Interior Entrances: The following provision applies to single-tenant buildings and multiple-tenant buildings that have entrances off of interior hallways. Each facade facing a Public Street may have one (1) wall sign above a featured main entrance, in the parapet at the top of the building, or in an architecturally designed location on the front façade. Under no circumstance shall more than two (2) wall signs be permitted on one (1) primary structure. Wall signs shall be limited by one of the following:
 - 1. Large Front Facade (parapet): Maximum of 120 square feet of sign area for front facades greater than 4,000 square feet when the sign is located along a parapet at the top edge of the building.
 - 2. *Large Front Facade (above entrance)*: Maximum of 80 square feet of sign area for front facades greater than 4,000 square feet when located above a featured main entrance.
 - 3. Large Front Façade (optional feature): if chosen shall replace option for a Large Front Façade (parapet) sign. Maximum of 200 square feet of sign area for front facades greater than 4,000 square feet when the sign is located along a front façade.
 - 4. *Small Front Facade (parapet)*: 3% of the total front facade area shall be the maximum square feet of sign area. This standard applies to front building facades less than 4,000 square feet in area
 - 5. *Small Front Facade (above entrance)*: 2% of the total front facade area shall be the maximum square feet of sign area for a sign located above a featured main entrance. This standard applies to front building facades less than 4,000 square feet in area.
 - 6. Façade Visible from West 106th Street (oriented to rear yard): shall be permitted to be improved with a rear facing sign not exceeding 12 square feet in size (being illuminated or non-illuminated).
- M. Wall Signs for Multiple-Tenant Buildings with Exterior Entrances: The following provision applies to multiple- tenant buildings with entrances to tenant spaces from the exterior. Each tenant with an exterior entrance may have one (1) wall sign limited to thirty (30) square feet, or one (1) foot of sign area per lineal foot of tenant frontage, whichever is greater. Each tenant sign shall be located in a space designed for wall signs above that tenant's entrance.
- N. <u>Ground Signs</u>: Ground Signs are not permitted by right. See the Architectural and Landscape Requirements for Subarea A in the next section for consideration of ground signs.
- O. <u>Screening Requirements</u>: Parcels adjacent to the Williams Glen apartment complex shall be required to install screening along the common property line, and within twenty (20) feet of that property line. Landscaping shall consist of native canopy tree species planted at a rate of one tree per forty (40) feet of contiguous boundary. The spacing of those trees should be irregular such to create a natural looking buffer. Therefore, the minimum spacing shall be twenty (20) feet and maximum spacing sixty (60) feet.
- P. Outside Storage and Operations: Not permitted
- Q. <u>Pedestrian Connectivity</u>: All buildings shall have a pedestrian/bikeway system in compliance with the following requirements:
 - 1. Sidewalk Connection: A minimum six (6) foot wide sidewalk shall functionally and efficiently connect the primary building entries with the public sidewalk or path system. These sidewalk connections are not required off of the side path along 106th Street.

2. Internal Trail System Connection: Any lot which abuts the internal trail system located in Subarea C shall provide a connection between those trails and the building. Said connection shall be a sidewalk or otherwise improved path, allowing a connection for pedestrians and bicyclists. If the internal trail system in Subarea C has not yet been installed, this requirement may be delayed up until the internal trail system is built. Upon its completion, the adjacent property owner shall be required to install their connection within six (6) months.

1.18 Architecture and Landscape Architecture Requirements for Subarea D:

- A. Review and Approval Authorization: The architecture of all initial buildings shall be subject to the Creekside Committee review and approval. The details of an approved project shall be written into the purchase agreement for the land being sold. Changes to a pre-existing building after the initial construction (e.g., an addition,
 - facade alteration, or the like) shall be reviewed by the Creekside Committee or the Zionsville Redevelopment Commission if the Creekside Committee is no longer in effect.
- B. <u>Interpretation and Application of Guidelines</u>: The Creekside Committee will interpret and determine the applicability of the below guidelines to each project. The Creekside Committee will strive for architecture and site improvements that are high quality, timeless, appropriate for a gateway into downtown Zionsville, and that create a development-wide aesthetic character.
- C. Building Height Guidelines:
 - 1. Buildings Along 106th Street: Any building located along 106th Street shall be at least two (2) stories, preferably three (3) or more.
 - 2. Buildings Not Along 106th Street: Any building located off of 106th Street is preferred to be two (2) stories
 - or more. However, buildings partially or fully within sixty (60) feet of the northern property line and adjacent to single-family residential lots, shall be no greater than two (2) stories.
- D. <u>Building Size Guidelines</u>: A high floor area ratio (FAR) is desired. It is the desire of this development to
 - fully utilize each parcel and to not allow land to be wasted. Green space beyond setbacks, parking lot islands, screening and buffering is discouraged (because the overall development is intended to have a large percentage of greenspace, trails, and park amenities). Similarly, an unnecessarily large parking lot is not desired.
 - E. <u>Building Facade Guidelines</u>: Any new building or building addition shall have the following characteristics and features:
 - 1. Buildings Along 106th Street: Any building located along 106th Street shall utilize four-sided architecture such that all facades and building features are highly detailed and aesthetic. These lots are visible from multiple directions and shall be held to the highest standard in the Creekside Corporate Park.
 - 2. Buildings Not Along 106th Street: Any building located off of 106th Street shall have high architectural standards, however only the facades and building features clearly visible from Creek Way (the internal street) are required to meet that standard.
 - 3. Facades that Face Residential Uses: Any building facade facing Williams Glen Apartments or single-family residential lots to the north shall have a high degree of architectural character as to be a good neighbor to that residential use. This provision shall not apply if the building is greater than 150 feet from the applicable property line.

- F. <u>Building Material Guidelines</u>: In order to create variation and interest in the built environment, all new buildings or building additions shall:
 - 1. Utilize at least two (2) building materials; excluding: windows (e.g., glass and frames), doors, and roofing material.
 - 2. The primary exterior material for any facade visible from 106th Street shall be one of the following:
 - a. brick,
 - b. architectural concrete that is colored and textured to closely resemble brick or stone,
 - c. External Insulation and Finish System (E.I.F.S.), or
 - d. stone.
 - 3. The primary exterior material for any facade not visible from 106th Street shall be one of the following:
 - a. brick,
 - b. wood.
 - c. fiber cement.
 - d. architectural concrete that is colored and textured to closely resemble brick or stone,
 - e. External Insulation and Finish System (E.I.F.S.), or
 - f. stone.

G. Roof Guidelines:

- 1. Pitched Roof: Pitched roofs shall only be permitted on smaller lots toward the rear of the development. Pitched roofs shall be simply and symmetrically pitched and only in the configuration of gables and hips, with pitches ranging from 5:12 to 12:12. Pitched roofs shall be clad in architectural, dimensional shingles or raised seam metal when done so for rainwater collection or other green building practice. Roof color shall be complementary to the design of the building. The Creekside Committee may approve additional material that clearly satisfies the intent of this subsection, and that is complementary of the building's architecture.
- 2. Shed Roofs: Shed roofs are generally not permitted
- 3. *Flat Roofs*: Flat roofs are permitted when consistent with the selected style of architecture, and if the top edge of the facade has some adornment or architectural character. Green roofs are permitted. Additionally, any rooftop mechanical equipment shall be reasonably screened.
- 4. *Roof Design*: In no case shall rooftop mechanical equipment be visible from 106th Street. All vents, attic ventilators, turbines, flues and other roof penetrations shall also be discrete.
- H. Entrance Guidelines: The main building or tenant space pedestrian entrances shall be defined and articulated by architectural elements such as lintels, pediments, pilasters, columns, and other design elements appropriate to the selected architectural style and details of the building as a whole. The location, orientation, proportion and style of doors shall reflect the chosen style of the building.
- I. <u>Window Guidelines</u>: All window designs shall be compatible with the style, materials, color, details and proportion of the building. All facades of a building shall have windows.
- J. Awning and Canopy Guidelines: Shall be the discretion of the Creekside Committee.

K. Lighting Guidelines:

- 1. *Shielding*: Any exterior lighting on any site shall be shielded to prevent light pollution (i.e., skyward) and light trespass (i.e., shining toward neighbors).
- 2. *Height*: The maximum height of any light fixtures, whether freestanding or mounted on a facade, for illumination of the site shall be twenty (20) feet.
- 3. Consistency: Light standards and fixtures on any lot, including free-standing light fixtures, those attached to buildings, security lights, and architectural lights, shall be of consistent design and

- material. Additionally, parking lot lights shall be of uniform size and height.
- 4. Facade illumination or sign lighting shall be carefully directed and shielded so that the light element is not visible from points along an adjacent public Right- of-Way.
- L. <u>Loading Dock Guidelines</u>: Loading docks shall not face 106th Street or the internal street, be visible from 106th Street, be visible from Williams Glen Apartments or the single-family residential lots to the north, or otherwise be a visual nuisance from an adjacent building.
- M. <u>Landscaping Guidelines</u>: Plants and hardscaping elements shall be chosen and installed to accomplish the following:
 - 1. General Aesthetic: To generally enhance the overall character of the site.
 - 2. *Screen Headlights*: To screen the headlights of cars from shining onto adjacent residential properties, and onto 106th Street and the internal street.
 - 3. Relieve Heat Island Effect: To utilize trees in and/or adjacent to parking lots to provide shade and aesthetic relief, especially in large parking lots. At least one landscape island shall be established per sixty (60) parking spaces, and at least one canopy or ornamental tree shall be planted in said island. Landscape islands shall be at least nine (9) feet square.
- N. <u>Bufferyard</u>: Lots adjacent to the northern property line adjacent to single-family residential lots shall install plant material, and/or a fence or wall for effective buffering. The Creekside Committee shall be responsible for approval of buffering proposals and may participate in the design discussions prior to submittal for approval.
- O. <u>Ground Sign Guidelines</u>: Ground signs are generally discouraged. However, a development-wide internal way- finding system utilizing high-quality sign materials is encouraged where appropriate. Ground Signs located along 106th Street shall be subject to the Creekside Committee and shall be similar in area, height, location, materials, and lighting as to assure a uniform and highly aesthetic development-wide character.

1.19 Low Impact Development for Subarea D:

- A. <u>Parking Lot Design</u>: Parking lots shall be designed using low impact development best practices to reduce, absorb, and filter storm water rather than pipe it to a retention pond or other outlet. The use of french drains, cisterns, brick pavers, pervious pavement, rain gardens, swales, vaults, and the like should be considered.
- B. <u>Stormwater Runoff from a Building</u>: The impervious surface created by a building should be offset through utilization of green roofs, pervious sidewalks, brick pavers, rain gardens, rain barrels, cisterns, swales, selection of plant material, and the like.
- C. <u>Retention Pond/Detention Basin</u>: Retention ponds are strongly discouraged. Short-term detention basins are supported.

1.20 Development Standards for Subarea E

- A. <u>Review and Approval Authorization</u>: The development standards listed below shall be subject to Zoning Administrator review and approval in perpetuity
- B. <u>Variances</u>: Any variance to the below listed development standards shall be considered by the Zionsville Board of Zoning Appeals.
- C. Minimum Lot Width: As Platted.
- D. Minimum Lot Frontage: As Platted
- E. Minimum Front Yard Setbacks: Measured from the right-of-way.
 - 1. From 106th Street: 40 feet for buildings, 20 feet for parking lots.
 - 2. From Internal Public or Private Streets: 30 feet for buildings, 15 feet for parking lots.
- F. Maximum Building Setback: Measured from the right-of-way.
 - 1. From 106th Street: 120 feet for buildings.

- 2. From Internal Public or Private Streets: Not applicable.
- G. <u>Minimum Side and Rear Yard Setback</u>: Measured from the lot lines unless multiple contiguous lots are owned. If multiple lots, setbacks measured from combined exterior lot perimeter
 - 1. Minimum Side Yard: 30 feet for buildings, 5 feet for parking lots.
 - 2. *Minimum Rear Yard*: 30 feet for buildings, 10 feet for parking lots and where adjacent to Subarea C.
- H. <u>Maximum Front Yard Parking Lot</u>: Any parking lot located between the front building line and 106th Street's right-of-way shall be limited to either a single loaded parking area or a double loaded parking area, served by not more than one (1) interior access drive or aisle, and where the interior access drive or aisle is located generally parallel to the street right-of-way. These requirements do not apply to sideyards.
- I. Maximum Height: 60 feet for all buildings
- J. Off-Street Parking: See the Zionsville Zoning Ordinance, as amended.
- K. Off-Street Loading: Shall be limited to two (2) truck loading bays for buildings over 20,000 main floor square feet and one (1) bay for buildings between 8,000 and 20,000 main floor square feet. Buildings smaller than 8,000 square feet are not permitted truck loading bays. Any building that is not able to locate truck loading bays in a non-conspicuous facade or otherwise aesthetically shield them from view from a Public Street shall not be permitted truck loading bays. Passenger vehicle drive-in doors shall not be subject to the foregoing limitations.
- L. <u>106th Street Vehicular Connectivity:</u> One right-in and right-out access will be allowed.
- M. Wall Signs:
 - 1. Building I 10850 Creek Way
 - a. Wall Signs (south façade facing 106th Street)
 - i. Total Number Permitted: 4
 - ii. One of each sign below is permitted:
 - Tenant #1: 240 square feet
 - Tenant #2: 180 square feet
 - Tenant #3: 100 square feet
 - Tenant #4: 60 square feet
 - b. Wall Signs (east façade)
 - i. Total Number Permitted: 4
 - ii. One of each sign below is permitted:
 - Tenant #3: 100 square feet
 - Service for Tenants 1, 2 or 3: 48 square feet
 - Tenant #3: 40 square feet
 - Tenant #2: 30 square feet
 - 2. Building II 10814 Creek Way
 - a. Wall Signs (south façade)
 - i. Total Number Permitted: 3
 - ii. One of each sign below is permitted:
 - Tenant #1: 145 square feet
 - Tenant #2: 80 square feet
 - Tenant #3: 6 square feet

- b. Projecting Sign (south façade)
 - i. Total Number permitted: 1
 - ii. Tenant #1: up to 25 square feet
- c. Wall Signs (east façade)
 - i. Tenant #1: Total Number Permitted: up to 4
 - ii. Tenant #1: Total square feet: up to 160 square feet
 - iii. Tenant #4: sign, not to exceed 3% of the area of the tenant space located on the interior of the east facade
- d. Wall Signs (north facade)
 - i. Total Number Permitted: 1
 - ii. Tenant #4: sign not to exceed 3% of the area of the tenant space located on the interior of the north facade
- N. <u>Ground Signs</u>: Ground signs are generally discouraged. However, a development-wide internal way- finding system utilizing high-quality sign materials is encouraged where appropriate. Ground Signs located along 106th Street shall be subject to the Creekside Committee and shall be similar in area, height, location, materials, and lighting as to assure a uniform and highly aesthetic development-wide character.
- O. Outside Storage and Operations: Not permitted
- P. <u>Pedestrian Connectivity</u>: All buildings shall have a pedestrian/bikeway system with a minimum six (6) foot wide sidewalk shall functionally and efficiently connect the primary building entries with the public sidewalk or path system.

1.21 Architecture and Landscape Architecture Requirements for Subarea E:

- A. Review and Approval Authorization: The architecture of all initial buildings shall be subject to the Creekside Committee review and approval. The details of an approved project shall be written into the purchase agreement for the land being sold. Changes to a pre-existing building after the initial construction (e.g., an addition, facade alteration, or the like) shall be reviewed by the Creekside Committee or the Zionsville Redevelopment Commission if the Creekside Committee is no longer in effect.

- D. <u>Building Size Guidelines</u>: A high floor area ratio (FAR) is desired. It is the desire of this development to fully utilize each parcel and to not allow land to be wasted. Green space beyond setbacks, parking lot islands, screening and buffering is discouraged (because the overall development is intended to have a large percentage of greenspace, trails, and park amenities). Similarly, an unnecessarily large parking lot is not desired unless Primary building user/tenant hosts events.
- E. <u>Building Facade Guidelines</u>: Any new building or building addition shall have the following characteristics and features:
 - 1. Buildings Along 106th Street: Any building located along 106th Street shall utilize four-sided architecture such that all facades and building features are highly detailed and

- aesthetic. These lots are visible from multiple directions and shall be held to the highest standard in the Creekside Corporate Park.
- 2. Buildings Not Along 106th Street: Any building located off 106th Street shall have high architectural standards, however only the facades and building features clearly visible from Creek Way (the internal street) are required to meet that standard.
- F. <u>Building Material Guidelines</u>: To create variation and interest in the built environment, all new buildings or building additions shall:
 - 1. Utilize at least two (2) building materials; excluding: windows (e.g., glass and frames), doors, and roofing material.
 - 2. The primary exterior material for any facade (whether visible from 106th Street or not) shall be one of the following:
 - a. Brick (i.e., Full-depth Face Brick),
 - b. Architectural concrete (Blocks [Burnished/Ground Face], Poured in Place),
 - c. Metal Panels (Concealed Fastened Panels including Architectural Metal Panels, Flat Plate interlocking metal Panels, Perforated Metal Panels)
 - d. Composite Panels (Concealed Fastened Panels including Ultra high-performance concrete [UHPC], High Pressure Laminate [HPL] or similar)
 - e. Visible Heavy Timber and/or Cross Laminated Timber (CLT) Construction
- G. <u>Building Components and other Structural Elements</u>: Metal (e.g., Aluminum, Steel, Zinc) components, columns, and other structural elements shall be allowed

H. Roof Guidelines:

- 1. *Pitched Roof*: Pitched roofs shall only be permitted on smaller lots toward the rear of the development. Pitched roofs shall be simply and symmetrically pitched, with pitches ranging from 5:12 to 12:12. Pitched roofs shall be clad in architectural, dimensional shingles or raised seam metal when done so for rainwater collection or other green building practice. Roof color shall be complementary to the design of the building. The Creekside Committee may approve additional material that clearly satisfies the intent of this subsection, and that is complementary of the building's architecture.
- 2. Shed/Single Slope Roofs: Are generally permitted
- 3. *Flat Roofs*: Flat roofs are permitted when consistent with the selected style of architecture, and if the top edge of the facade has some adornment or architectural character. Green roofs are permitted. Additionally, any rooftop mechanical equipment shall be reasonably screened.
- 4. *Roof Design*: In no case shall rooftop mechanical equipment be visible from 106th Street. All vents, attic ventilators, turbines, flues, and other roof penetrations shall also be discrete.
- 5. The Creekside Committee, consisting of the Zionsville Community Development Corporation and Zionsville Redevelopment Commission, may approve additional roof types that clearly satisfies the intent of this subsection, and that is complementary of the building's architecture.
- I. <u>Window Guidelines</u>: All window designs shall be compatible with the style, materials, color, details, and proportion of the building. All facades of a building shall have windows.
- J. Awning and Canopy Guidelines: Shall be the discretion of the Creekside Committee.

K. Lighting Guidelines:

- 1. *Shielding*: Any exterior lighting on any site shall be shielded to prevent light pollution (i.e., skyward) and light trespass (i.e., shining toward neighbors).
- 2. *Height*: The maximum height of any light fixtures, whether freestanding or mounted on a facade, for illumination of the site shall be twenty (20) feet.

- 3. *Consistency*: Light standards and fixtures on any lot, including free-standing light fixtures, those attached to buildings, security lights, and architectural lights, shall be of consistent design and material. Additionally, parking lot lights shall be of uniform size and height.
- 4. Facade illumination or sign lighting shall be carefully directed and shielded so that the light element is not visible from points along an adjacent public Right- of-Way.
- 5. Architectural: Features include a static backlit accent bar located along the south and east facades of Building I and II. Mono and multi-chromatic colors are permissible. Maximum length: not to exceed 80% of each tenant façade where the accent bar is situated. Maximum height: one (1) foot.
- L. <u>Loading Dock Guidelines</u>: Loading docks shall not face 106th Street.
- M. <u>Landscaping Guidelines</u>: Plants and hardscaping elements shall be chosen and installed to accomplish the following:
 - 1. General Aesthetic: To generally enhance the overall character of the site.
 - 2. *Screen Headlights*: To screen the headlights of cars from shining onto adjacent residential properties, and onto 106th Street and the internal street.
 - 3. Relieve Heat Island Effect: To utilize trees in and/or adjacent to parking lots to provide shade and aesthetic relief, especially in large parking lots. At least one landscape island shall be established per sixty (60) parking spaces, and at least one canopy or ornamental tree shall be planted in said island. Landscape islands shall be at least nine (9) feet square.
- N. Ground Sign Guidelines: Ground signs are generally discouraged. However, a development-wide internal way- finding system utilizing high-quality sign materials is encouraged where appropriate. Ground Signs located along 106th Street shall be subject to the Creekside Committee and shall be similar in area, height, location, materials, and lighting as to assure a uniform and highly aesthetic development-wide character.
- O. <u>Stormwater Management:</u> Open retention/detention systems are permitted with enhanced park-like landscaping as approved by the Creekside Committee.

1.22 Low Impact Development for Subarea E:

- A. <u>Parking Lot Design</u>: Parking lots shall be designed using low impact development best practices to reduce, absorb, and filter stormwater rather than pipe it to a retention pond or other outlet. The use of french drains, cisterns, brick pavers, pervious pavement, rain gardens, swales, vaults, and the like should be considered but are not required.
- B. <u>Stormwater Runoff from a Building</u>: The impervious surface created by a building should be offset through utilization of green roofs, pervious sidewalks, brick pavers, rain gardens, rain barrels, cisterns, swales, selection of plant material, rainwater capture facilities and the like.

1.23 Administration

- A. <u>Relationship to the Zionsville Zoning Ordinance</u>: Where the Creekside Corporate Park PUD is silent, the most relevant regulations from the Town of Zionsville Zoning Ordinance, as amended, and as determined by the Zoning Administrator shall apply.
- B. <u>Subdivision Control</u>: All lots established within Creekside Corporate Park shall be approved through the subdivision process as set forth in the Town of Zionsville Subdivision Control Ordinance.
- C. Accessory Uses:
 - 1. Accessory Uses shall not be permitted on a lot prior to the erection of the Primary Building.
 - 2. No Accessory Use or Structure shall be permitted in any required Front, Side or Rear Yard.

D. Access

1. Median Cuts Along 106th Street: There shall be no more than two (2) median cuts along 106th Street within the boundary of Creekside Corporate Park; those being directly across from the main entrance into the Lids development and the other directly across from Dahlia Drive. Any other median cut shall be strongly discouraged and shall only be considered for

- exceptional purposes. An additional median cut shall be approved by the Creekside Committee and the Zionsville Plan Commission.
- 2. Curb Cut Along 106th Street: There shall be no more than two (2) curb cuts into the Creekside Corporate Park's north side (i.e., land north of 106th Street). Those curb cuts shall be as described in the median cut language above.
- E. <u>Development Timetable</u>: Major infrastructure has been put in place by the Town of Zionsville and development of the site will occur as demand dictates.
- F. Appeals: Any final official determination of the Zoning Administrator under this Creekside Corporate Park PUD, including the determination to issue or not issue an Improvement Location Permit, shall be a determination appealable to the Town of Zionsville Board of Zoning Appeals. Approvals of architecture and landscaping assigned to the Creekside Committee are appealable to the full Zionsville Redevelopment Commission.
- G. Severability: It is hereby declared that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Petition for Zone Map Change are severable and, if any such section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase is declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction in a valid judgment or decree, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any remaining sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases of this Petition for Zone Map Change because the same would have been enacted without the incorporation into this Petition for Zone Map Change of such unconstitutional or invalid section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase.
 - H. <u>Definitions</u>: As per the Zoning Ordinance, as amended, including:
 - Williams Glen Apartments: The multiple-family development east of Creekside Corporate Park.
 - 2. Creekside Committee/Redevelopment Commission: Entity serving as the initial manager of the Covenants and Restrictions for Creekside Corporate Park. Upon initial buildout of 75% of the lots in Creekside Corporate Park, or at a date mutually agreed to by both the Commission and its Assigns (whichever is the earlier of the two), the Covenants and Restrictions for Creekside Corporate Park, as well as the role of the Creekside Committee, shall be assumed by the Assign.
